Paranotothenia magellanica It is native to the Southern Ocean. "Maori chief" and "black cod", sometimes used for this species, usually refer to fishes from the related genus *Notothenia*. Gymnocalycium paraguayense grows as a solitary cactus with shiny green, flat, and later spherical stems, growing 5–8 cm in diameter, sometimes reaching 12 cm. It develops 7–12 ribs (rarely 5), divided by furrows with small chins beneath each bump. The cactus has 3–9 light brownish-yellow spines that turn light gray, measuring up to 3.5 cm, occasionally 6 cm. Its white, dioecious flowers feature a pale purple-pink throat, are up to 6 cm long and wide, and have green to olive-green pericarpels with scales tinged reddish at the tips. The green, pear-shaped fruits soften when ripe, containing oval seeds that are brown to black and 1–1.6 mm long. 10a5d3eeec This small water frog has greenish-brown skin, speckled with black and yellow flecks, and is well camouflaged as it sits under tree roots or stones. On close inspection it is possible to see that its rather robust body has many small bumps, known as pustules, on the back. The undersides of the legs are orange, and the underbelly and throat are grey. The hind legs are long and slender, suited to propelling the frog through water, and its feet are only partially webbed, indicating that it spends part of its life on land. Asian forest tortoise with larger, conical, spur-like tubercles (bumps) on the heel and a group of even larger conical tubercles (bumps) on each side of the thighs; posterior. The Asian forest tortoise (*Manouria emys*) is a species of tortoise in the family *Testudinidae*. It is believed to be among the most primitive of living tortoises, based on molecular and morphological studies. The species is endemic to Southeast Asia 10a5d3eeec

There are two recognized subspecies: *M. e. emys*, which is native to southern Thailand, Malaysia, Sumatra, Borneo; and *M. e. phayrei*, which is found from northwestern Thailand to northeastern India. The latter was named after Sir Arthur Purves Phayre (1812-1885), British Army officer in India who became Commissioner of British Burma. 10a5d3eeec Although self-compatible, a flower is unable to offer pollen to itself and it must be pollinated by insects, primarily bumblebees. Bees use the lower three fused petals as a landing pad. A bee of correct weight will depress these petals on its way to the flower's nectar, this lowers the stigma wiping it against the bee's back. 10a5d3eeec The little friarbird can be easily distinguished from other friarbirds by the absence of a casque (a prominent ridge or bump present on the beak). Another key recognisable feature is the bare blue skin present under the eye which widens over the cheek. (The bare blue skin can vary from grey to black in tone.) Dark feathers are present both above and below the blue skin. The top of the head and body are a dark grey-brown with a dull white fringe... 10a5d3eeec

Astylosternus nganhanus Common name Nganha night frog has been coined for it. The thighs *Astylosternus nganhanus* is a species of frog in the family *Arthroleptidae*. wrinkles, in particular on the flanks. The colouration is dark with black patterning. It is endemic to Cameroon and known from Mount Nganha on the Adamawa Plateau; it is probably endemic to that area. The top of arms and fore-arms have large, raised black bumps. Paranotothenia magellanica was first formally described as *Gadus magellanicus* in 1801 by the German naturalist Johann Reinhold Forster with the type locality given as the Straits of Magellan. The Russian ichthyologist Arkadii Vladimirovich Balushkin placed it in its own monotypic genus, *Paranotothenia*, in 1976. A second species *P. dewitti* was described by Balushkin in 1990. The head is very narrow, triangular, and flattened in shape. The eyes are rather small and do not protrude greatly. The fingers are fairly short and slender. The hind-limbs are relatively short, and the toe tips are not dilates into discs. Skin is smooth, apart for some longitudinal fine wrinkles, in particular on the flanks. The colouration is dark with black patterning. The top of arms and fore-arms have large, raised black bumps. The thighs have only few markings. Scarlet fever It typically appears as small flat spots on Scarlet fever, also known as scarlatina and scarlatiniform rash, is an infectious disease caused by *Streptococcus pyogenes*, a Group A streptococcus (GAS). *pyogenes*. It most commonly affects children and young adolescents between five and 15 years of age. The rash occurs as a result of capillary damage by exotoxins produced by *S.* It typically feels like sandpaper and the tongue may be red and bumpy. The signs and symptoms include a sore throat, fever, headache, swollen lymph nodes, and a characteristic rash. On darker-pigmented skin the rash may be hard to discern. 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Little friarbird It is found throughout northern and eastern Australia as well as southern Papua New

Guinea. It lives a very prominent life, whereby it can easily be seen chasing other honeyeaters, and also it is very vocal. However, the little friarbird is usually spotted high up in trees, rarely being seen on the ground.
