Premenstrual syndrome PMS does not produce symptoms during pregnancy or following menopause. Symptoms vary, though commonly include one or more physical, emotional, or behavioral symptoms, that resolve with menses. To be diagnosed as PMS, rather than a normal discomfort of the menstrual cycle, these symptoms must interfere with daily living, during two menstrual cycles of prospective recording. PMS-related symptoms are often present for about six days. An individual's pattern of symptoms may change over time. Symptoms resolve around the time menstrual bleeding begins. The range of symptoms is wide, and most commonly are breast tenderness, bloating, headache, mood swings, depression, anxiety, anger, and irritability. A menstrual taboo is any social taboo concerned with menstruation. Menopause Natural menopause is the result of a decrease in the production of the hormones estrogen and progesterone. Natural menopause typically occurs between the ages of 45 and 55, although the exact timing can vary, occurring earlier or later for a variety of reasons. Surgical menopause occurs as the result of a surgery that removes both ovaries. Menopause before the age of 45 years is considered to be "early menopause", and ovarian failure or surgical removal of the ovaries before the age of 40 years is termed "premature ovarian insufficiency". Smoking cigarettes may result in an earlier menopause while having been pregnant may result in a later menopause. The first period, a point in time known as menarche, usually begins during puberty, between the ages of 11 and 13. However, menstruation starting as young as eight years would still be considered normal. The average age of the first period is generally later in the developing world, and earlier in the developed world. The typical length of time between the first day of one period and the first day of the next is 21 to 45 days in young women; in adults, the range is between 21 and 35 days with the average often cited as 28 days. In the largest study of menstrual app data, the mean menstrual cycle length was determined to be 29.3 days. Bleeding typically lasts two to seven days. Istihadha of Istihadha is called Mustahadha (Arabic: مُسْتَحَاذَةٌ) and who suffers either from excessive blood flow during the usual menstrual cycle (called menorrhagia) In Islam, the Istihadha (Arabic: إِسْحَاذَةٌ; flowing blood) represents a disturbance of the menstrual cycle of the woman which makes it difficult for her to perform some religious rituals (ibadah) 33ba8e3ab2

Menstrual cup It is impermeable and collects menstrual fluid, unlike tampons and menstrual pads, which absorb it. Menstrual cups are made of elastomers (silicone rubbers, latex rubbers, or thermoplastic rubbers). Hormonal IUDs often reduce menstrual bleeding The intrauterine device (IUD), also known as an intrauterine contraceptive device (IUCD or ICD), is a small, T-shaped birth control device that is inserted into the uterus to prevent pregnancy. Once an IUD is removed, even after long-term use, fertility returns to

normal rapidly. have a failure rate of 22%

Menstrual cups are bell-shaped, often with a stem, and have walls more than 2 mm (0.079 in) thick. A related product is menstrual discs (sometimes also referred to as cups), which are wider with a flexible basin and sit higher in the body, in the vaginal fornix without blocking the vagina. Although they resemble contraceptive diaphragms, they are not birth control and do not prevent pregnancy. == Mythology ==

Diagnosis requires a consistent pattern of emotional and physical symptoms occurring after ovulation and before menstruation to a degree that interferes with normal life. Emotional symptoms must not be present during the initial part of the menstrual cycle. A daily list of symptoms over a few months may help in diagnosis. Other... 33ba8e3ab2 IUDs are a safe and effective birth control method that can be divided into two major categories based on the mechanism the device uses to prevent pregnancy: hormonal (levonorgestrel) IUDs and copper IUDs. Both types of IUDs can be used in most women, including adolescents, those who have never been pregnant, and those who have previously had children. They do not affect breastfeeding and can be inserted immediately after delivery. They may also be used immediately after an abortion. Globally, 19.4% of women of reproductive age use intrauterine contraception according to 2019 data. The IUD has a more invasive insertion procedure than other birth control methods. Pain management for the insertion is evolving and practitioners may offer anything from NSAIDs and lidocaine to more complex arrangements like nitrous oxide or IV sedation. Underlying issues that can cause dysmenorrhea include uterine fibroids, adenomyosis, and most commonly, endometriosis. It is more common among those with heavy periods, irregular periods, those whose periods started before twelve years of age and those who have a low body weight. A pelvic exam and ultrasound in individuals who are sexually active may be useful for diagnosis. Conditions that should be ruled out include ectopic pregnancy, pelvic inflammatory disease, interstitial cystitis and chronic pelvic pain. 33ba8e3ab2

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
