Odontogenic infections can be severe if not treated and are associated with mortality rate of 10 to 40%. Furthermore, about 70% of odontogenic infections occur as periapical inflammation, i.e. acute periapical periodontitis or a periapical abscess. The next most common form of odontogenic infection is the periodontal abscess. remodeling, which most other imaging techniques (such as X-ray computed tomography, CT) cannot. Bone scintigraphy competes with positron emission tomography (PET) for imaging of abnormal metabolism in bones, but is considerably less expensive. Bone scintigraphy has higher sensitivity but lower specificity than CT or MRI for diagnosis of scaphoid fractures following negative plain radiography. 59298956bd They most often form following a diabetic foot ulcer, though not all foot ulcers become infected. Diabetic foot ulcers can be caused by vascular disease or neuropathy and its prevalence occurs in approximately 25% of diabetics throughout their lifetime. Some risk factors for developing diabetic foot infections include history of repeated foot ulcers, foot ulcers lasting for longer than 30 days, poor control over blood glucose levels, peripheral neuropathy, renal impairment, peripheral artery disease, injury or trauma to foot, walking barefoot frequently, and history of amputation in lower limbs. Bone marrow suppression Bone marrow suppression is a serious side effect of chemotherapy and certain drugs affecting the immune system such as azathioprine. in the bone marrow and is associated with a number of different diseases ranging from benign to severe. Adequate nutrient intake has been found to significantly affect the integrity of the fracture repair. Age, bone type, drug therapy and pre-existing bone pathology are factors that affect healing. The role of bone healing is to produce new bone without a scar as seen in other tissues which would be a structural weakness or deformity. 59298956bd Infectious diseases remain a significant global health concern; communicable, maternal, neonatal, and nutritional diseases together accounted for an estimated 18.6% of global deaths in 2017. == Signs and symptoms == 59298956bd Bone generally has the ability to regenerate completely but requires a very small fracture space or some sort of scaffold to do so. Bone grafts may be autologous (bone harvested from the patient's own body, often from the iliac crest), allograft (cadaveric bone usually obtained from a bone bank), or synthetic (often made of hydroxyapatite or other naturally occurring and biocompatible substances) with similar mechanical properties to bone. Most bone grafts are expected to be resorbed and replaced as the natural bone heals over a few months' time. 59298956bd The principles involved in successful bone grafts include osteoconduction... 59298956bd

for bacterial infections. 59298956bd A bone fracture may be the result of high force impact or stress, or a minimal trauma injury as a result of certain medical conditions that weaken the bones, such as osteoporosis, osteopenia, bone cancer, or osteogenesis imperfecta, where the fracture is then properly termed a pathologic fracture. Most bone fractures require urgent medical attention to prevent further injury. 59298956bd Nonsteroidal anti-inflammatory drugs (NSAIDs), in some rare instances, may also cause bone marrow suppression. The decrease in blood cell counts does not occur right at the start of chemotherapy because the drugs do not destroy the cells already in the bloodstream (these are not dividing rapidly). Instead, the drugs affect new blood cells that are being made by the bone marrow. When myelosuppression is severe, it is called myeloablation. 59298956bd

Bone grafting This surgical procedure is useful Bone grafting is a type of transplantation used to replace missing bone tissue or stimulate the healing of fractures. Additionally, structural or

morcellized bone grafting can be used in joint replacement revision surgery when wide osteolysis is present. While some small or acute fractures can heal without bone grafting, the risk is greater for large fractures, such as compound fractures. Bone grafting is a type of transplantation used to replace missing bone tissue or stimulate the healing of fractures. This surgical procedure is useful for repairing bone fractures that are extremely complex, pose a significant health risk to the patient, or fail to heal properly, leading to pseudoarthrosis 59298956bd

Odontogenic infection The term is derived from *odonto-* (Ancient Greek: *ὀδοῦς*, *odoús* - 'tooth') and *-genic* (Ancient Greek: *-γενής*, *-γενῶς*; *-genés*, *-genôs* - 'birth'). Odontogenic infection starts as localised infection and may remain localised to the region where it started, or spread into adjacent or distant areas. In adults, the most commonly affected site is the spine and in pediatric populations the most commonly affected site is the long bones. Diagnosis is suspected on the basis of clinical presentation and aided by laboratory and imaging studies and made definitive by biopsy and culture of the presenting area. Treatment of bacterial OM involves antimicrobials and can involve surgery or even amputation. surgery may facilitate healing, a fracture ultimately heals through physiological processes. The healing process is mainly determined by the periosteum... 59298956bd The process of the entire regeneration of the bone can depend on the angle of dislocation or fracture. While the bone formation usually spans the entire duration of the healing process, in some instances, bone marrow within the fracture has healed two or fewer weeks before the final remodelling phase. 59298956bd
