It is widely grown in the tropics and subtropics by small and large commercial producers, both as a grain legume and as an oil crop. Underground fruiting (geocarpy) is atypical among legumes, which led botanist Carl Linnaeus to name the species *hypogaea*, from Greek 'under the earth' 2c87ceb9e8

Coleorhiza Root of corn with rootcap and coleorhiza Barrero, José The coleorhiza or root sheath is a protective layer of tissue that surrounds the radicle (the embryonic primary root) in monocotyledon seeds. D=Endosperm, E=Coleorhiza, F=Radicle, G=Hypocotyl, H=Plumule, I=Scutellum, J=Coleoptile. Also the adventitious roots have a coleorhiza. Scale=1. Soon afterwards, it is pierced through by the emerging primary root and then remains like a collar around the root base. Jane Ingham Ingham and Priestley were the first to isolate cell walls from the middle lamella of the radicle and plumule meristems of *Vicia faba* Rose Marie "Jane" Ingham (née Tupper-Carey ; 15 August 1897 – 10 September 1982) was an English botanist and scientific translator. She was appointed research assistant to Joseph Hubert Priestley in the Botany Department at the University of Leeds, and together, they were the first to separate cell walls from the root tip of broad beans. She carried out experiments on the cork layer of trees to study how cells function under a change of orientation and found profound differences in cell division and elongation in the epidermal layer of plants. The peanut belongs to the flowering plant family Fabaceae (or Leguminosae), commonly known as the pea family, and is native to South America. Like most other legumes, peanuts harbor symbiotic nitrogen-fixing bacteria in root nodules, which improve soil fertility, making them valuable in crop rotations. 2c87ceb9e8

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
