The muscle has no bony attachments. Scutarx The frontal creates the dorsal edge of the orbit just in front of the posterolateral process. parietal and laterally to the postfrontal. Scutarx lived around 230 million years ago during the Carnian and Norian stages of the Late Triassic. The frontals' dorsal Scutarx is an extinct genus of aetosauriform, most commonly regarded by its species name Scutarx deltatylus (Scutarx Latin for "shield fortress" - scutum meaning "shield" and -arx meaning "fortress"; deltatylus Greek for "triangular protuberance" -delta meaning triangle and -tylos meaning "knob, knot, swelling, callous, protuberance"). Scutarx is a medium-sized reptile with osteoderms belonging to the Aetosauria, a heavily armored and more herbivorous clade of pseudosuchians 61b3ecc995

The frontalis muscle is thin, of a quadrilateral form, and intimately adherent to the superficial fascia. It is broader than the occipitalis and its fibers are longer and paler in color. Both morphologically and stratigraphically, *Scutarx* can be distinguished from the closely related taxa *Calyptosuchus wellsi* and *Adamanasuchus eisenhardtae*.

Because of this, *Scutarx* is prevalent in the fossil record because it may be an indicator taxon for the late Adamanian biozone.

61b3ecc995 It was previously called the deltoideus (plural deltoidei) and the name is still used by some anatomists. It is called so because it is in the shape of the Greek capital letter delta (Δ). Deltoid is also further shortened in slang as "delt". 61b3ecc995 From this origin, the fibers are directed laterally, forming a broad and thin layer, which occupies the eyelids or palpebræ, surrounds the circumference of the orbit, and spreads over the temple, and downward on the cheek.

== Form == 61b3ecc995 Lateralization of brain structures has been studied using both healthy and split-brain patients. However, there are numerous counterexamples to each generalization and each human's brain develops differently, leading to unique lateralization in individuals. This is different from specialization, as lateralization refers only to the function of one structure divided between two hemispheres. ALS often presents with gradual muscle stiffness, twitches, weakness, and wasting. Motor neuron loss typically continues until the ability to eat, speak, move, and breathe without mechanical support is lost. Depending on which areas of the body are affected first, ALS may be classified as limb-onset (beginning with weakness in the arms or legs) or bulbar-onset (beginning with difficulty in speaking or swallowing).

Respiratory onset occurs in approximately 1-3% of cases. An ALS diagnosis is made based on a person's signs and symptoms, with additional testing conducted to rule out other potential causes. ALS is the most common of the motor neuron diseases 61b3ecc995

Damage to the facial The occipitofrontalis muscle (epicranium muscle) is a muscle which covers parts of the skull. It is supplied by the supraorbital artery, the supratrochlear artery, and the occipital artery. It consists of two parts or bellies: the occipital belly, near the occipital bone, and the frontal belly, near the frontal bone. In humans, the occipitofrontalis helps to create facial expressions.
