Parasitic flies of domestic animals Many species of brachyceran flies such as the house-flies and blow-flies that do not feed on blood are also mechanical transmitters Many species of flies of the two-winged type, order Diptera, such as mosquitoes, horseflies, blowflies, and warbleflies, cause direct parasitic disease to domestic animals, and transmit organisms that cause diseases. The article is organized following the taxonomic hierarchy of these flies in the phylum Arthropoda, order Insecta. These infestations and infections cause distress to companion animals, and in livestock industry the financial costs of these diseases are high. Disease caused by small pathogenic organisms that pass from the flies to domestic animals is described here under transmitted organisms; prominent examples are provided from the many species. Mayflies have long tails and wings that do not fold flat over the abdomen. The female housefly usually mates only once and stores the sperm for later use. It lays batches of about 100 eggs on decaying organic matter such as food waste, carrion, or feces. These soon hatch into legless white larvae, known as maggots. After two to five days of development, these metamorphose into reddish-brown pupae, about 8 millimetres (3⁄8 inch) long. Adult flies normally live for two to four weeks, but can hibernate during the winter. The adults feed on a variety of liquid or semi-liquid substances, as well as solid materials which have been softened by their saliva. They can carry pathogens on their bodies and in their feces, contaminate food, and contribute to the transfer of food-borne illnesses, while, in numbers, they can be physically annoying. Their wing arrangement gives them great manoeuvrability in flight, and claws and pads on their feet enable them to cling to smooth surfaces. Flies undergo complete metamorphosis; the eggs are often laid on the larval food-source and the larvae, which lack true limbs, develop in a protected environment, often inside their food source. Other species are ovoviviparous, opportunistically depositing hatched or hatching larvae, instead of eggs, on carrion, dung, decaying material, or open wounds of mammals.
