Most pencil cores are made of graphite powder mixed with a clay binder. These authorities are responsible for vetting the risk/benefit ratio of the trial—their approval does not mean the therapy is "safe" or effective, only that the trial may be conducted. Prior to the emergence of machine learning, bioinformatics algorithms had to be programmed by hand; for problems such as protein structure prediction, this proved difficult. Machine learning techniques such as deep learning can learn features of data sets rather than requiring the programmer to define them individually. The algorithm can further learn how to combine low-level features into more abstract features, and so on. This multi-layered approach allows such systems to make sophisticated predictions when appropriately trained.
