Positive and negative predictive values The PPV and NPV describe the performance of a diagnostic test or other statistical measure. The PPV and NPV are not intrinsic to the test (as true positive rate and true negative rate are); they depend also on the prevalence. Both PPV and NPV can be derived using Bayes' theorem.

where a "true negative" is the event that the test makes a negative The positive and negative predictive values (PPV and NPV respectively) are the proportions of positive and negative results in statistics and diagnostic tests that are true positive and true negative results, respectively. A high result can be interpreted as indicating the accuracy of such a statistic

Negative number A debt that is owed may be thought of as a negative asset. Equivalently, a negative number is a real number that is less than zero. Negative numbers are often used to represent the magnitude of a loss or deficiency. If a quantity, such as the charge on an electron, may have either of two opposite senses, then one may choose to distinguish between those senses—perhaps arbitrarily—as positive and negative. Negative numbers are used to describe values on a scale that

goes below zero, such as the Celsius and Fahrenheit scales for temperature. For example, $-(-3) = 3$ because the opposite of an opposite is the original value. Equivalently, a negative number is a real number that is less than zero. Likelihood ratios in diagnostic testing The first description of the use of likelihood ratios for decision rules was made at a symposium on information theory in 1954. There is a multiclass version of these likelihood ratios. They combine sensitivity and specificity into a single metric that indicates how much a test result shifts the probability that a condition (such as a disease) is present. test positive (T+) and have the disease (D+), and "false positives" are those that test positive (T+) but do not have the disease (D-). "happiness". Positive psychologists study empirically the conditions and processes that contribute to flourishing, subjective well-being, and happiness, often using these terms interchangeably. 28094423dc Positive rights, as initially proposed in 1979 by the Czech jurist Karel Vařák, may include other civil and political rights such as the right to counsel and police protection of person and property. Additionally, they may include economic, social and cultural rights such as food, housing, public education, employment, national security, military, health care, social security, internet access, and a minimum standard of living. In the "three generations" account of human rights, negative rights are often associated with the first generation of rights, while positive rights are associated with the second and third generations. 28094423dc

" Although the definition of the term greatly varies among those involved in the movement, its central notion is "openness to a variety of sexual orientations, interests (or lack thereof), identities and expressions. This represents a distinct shift from focusing on individual happiness and success to the dual vision of individual well-being and collective humanity. It is more about bringing out the "better angels of our nature" than achieving optimal happiness or personal success. This emerging movement is a response to perceived problems of what some have called "positive psychology as usual". Interplay between good and evil, negatives and positives, is one of the hallmarks of EPP. It is a therapeutic approach in psychology that attempts to bring out the best in individuals and society by incorporating the dark side of human existence through the dialectical principles of yin and yang.
