

Fully Qualified Domain Name

The Domain Name System delegates the responsibility of assigning domain names and mapping those names to Internet resources by designating authoritative name servers for each domain. Network administrators may delegate authority over subdomains of their allocated name space to other name servers. This mechanism provides distributed and fault-tolerant service and was designed to avoid a single large central database. In addition, the DNS specifies the technical functionality of the database service that is at its core. The top-level domain names are installed in the root zone of the name space. Domain names are organized in subordinate levels (subdomains) of the DNS root domain, which is nameless. Domain name A fully qualified domain name (FQDN) is a domain name In the Internet, a domain name is a string that identifies a realm of administrative autonomy, authority, or control. Domain names are often used to identify services provided through the Internet, such as websites, email services, and more. In general, a domain name identifies a network domain or an Internet Protocol (IP) resource, such as a personal computer used to access the Internet, or a server computer. Domain names are used in various networking contexts and for application-specific naming and addressing purposes. domain name is usually administered by a domain name registrar who sell its services to the public a2edd7cfb8

In an IPv4 environment, search domains are often set via DHCPv4, along with the local domain name. The domain search list is configured by the Domain Search Option (DHCPv4 option number 119), while the local domain name is configured by Domain Name (DHCPv4 option number 15). a2edd7cfb8

Internet hostnames may have appended the name of a Domain Name System (DNS) domain, separated from the host-specific label by a period ("dot"). In the latter form, a hostname is also called a domain name. If the domain name is completely specified, including a top-level domain of the Internet, then the hostname is said to be a fully qualified domain name (FQDN). Hostnames that include DNS domains are often stored in the Domain Name System together with the IP addresses of the host they represent for the purpose of mapping the hostname to an address, or the reverse process. a2edd7cfb8 For example, for email address "ktrout@finance.corpudyne.com", the doppelganger domain would be "financecorpudyne.com"; hence, an email accidentally addressed to "ktrout@financecorpudyne.com" (i.e. with the dot between "finance" and "corpudyne" having accidentally been omitted) would go to the doppelganger domain rather than to the legitimate user. a2edd7cfb8 == IPv4 == a2edd7cfb8 An example of a FQDA is: localpart@mailhost.example.com. The Domain Name System has been an essential component of the functionality of the Internet since 1985. Typosquatting's traditional attack vector is through the web to distribute malware or harvest credentials. Other vectors include email and remote access services such as Secure Shell (SSH), Remote Desktop Protocol (RDP), and Virtual Private Networks (VPN). In a whitepaper by Godai Group on doppelganger domains, they demonstrated that numerous emails can be harvested without anyone noticing. a2edd7cfb8 An example of a name server is the server component of the Domain Name System (DNS), the core namespaces of the Internet. The most important function of DNS servers is the translation (resolution) of human-memorable domain names and hostnames into the corresponding numeric Internet Protocol (IP) addresses, which can be routed in the Internet. a2edd7cfb8

Name server It translates an often humanly meaningful, text-based identifier to a system-internal, often numeric identification or addressing component. Every domain name appears in a zone served by one or more authoritative name servers.
