

Bee How Long Does It Live

The European bee-eater was formally described by the Swedish naturalist Carl Linnaeus in 1758 in the tenth edition of his *Systema Naturae* under its current binomial name *Merops apiaster*. The genus name *Merops* (μέροψ) is Ancient Greek for "bee-eater", and *apiaster* is Latin, also meaning "bee-eater", from *apis*, "bee". 0f1cb3caae

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Geographic isolation led... The Bee Gees were an Australian-British musical group formed in 1958 by brothers Barry, Robin, and Maurice Gibb.
