Qualitative designs emphasize understanding of social phenomena through direct observation, communication with participants, or analyses of texts, and may stress contextual subjective accuracy over generality.

Qualitative research is often used to explore complex phenomena or to gain insight into people's experiences and perspectives on a particular topic. Qualitative research methods have been used in sociology, anthropology, political science, psychology, communication studies, social work, folklore, educational research, information science and software engineering research. This type of research typically involves in-depth interviews, focus groups, or field observations in order to collect data that is rich in detail and context.

When understood in the widest sense, methodology also includes the discussion of these more abstract issues. A method is a structured procedure for bringing about a certain goal, like acquiring knowledge or verifying knowledge claims. The study of methods concerns a detailed description and analysis of these processes. This way, it is assessed what advantages and disadvantages they have and for what research goals they may be used. Qualitative research has been informed by several strands of philosophical thought and examines... An artist drawing, for instance, may choose to draw from what he or she observes in front of them, or from what they imagine, or from what they already know about the subject. These 3 methods will, very probably, produce 3 very different pictures. A careful methodology would include examination of the materials and tools used and how a different type of canvas/brush/paper/pencil/rag/camera/chisel etc. would produce a different effect. The artist may also look at various effects achieved by starting in one part of a canvas first, or by working over the whole surface equally. An author may experiment with stream of consciousness writing, as opposed to naturalistic narrative, or a combination of styles. The term multimethodology was used starting in the 1980s and in the 1989 book *Multimethod Research: A Synthesis of Styles* by John Brewer and Albert Hunter. During the 1990s and currently, the term mixed methods research has become more popular for this research movement in the behavioral, social, business, and health sciences. This pluralistic research approach has been gaining in popularity since

the 1980s. Most methods contain elements of both. For example, qualitative data analysis often involves a fairly structured approach to coding raw data into systematic information and quantifying intercoder reliability. Conceptual analysis decomposes concepts into fundamental constituents. Common-sense philosophers use widely held beliefs as their starting point of inquiry, whereas ordinary language philosophers extract philosophical insights from ordinary language. Intuition-based methods, like thought experiments, rely on non-inferential impressions.
