Surgical care Cataracts may require Galactokinase deficiency is an autosomal recessive metabolic disorder marked by an accumulation of galactose and galactitol secondary to the decreased conversion of galactose to galactose-1-phosphate by galactokinase. Unlike classic galactosemia, which is caused by a deficiency of galactose-1-phosphate uridylyltransferase, galactokinase deficiency does not present with severe manifestations in early infancy. Its major clinical symptom is the development of cataracts during the first weeks or months of life, as a result of the accumulation, in the lens, of galactitol, a product of an alternative route of galactose utilization. Some studies have suggested that, depending. The disorder is caused by mutations in the GALK1 gene, located on chromosome 17q24. outpatient basis. Galactokinase catalyzes the first step of galactose phosphorylation in the Leloir pathway of intermediate metabolism. Cataracts that do not regress or disappear with therapy may require hospitalization for surgical removal. The development of early cataracts in homozygous affected infants is fully preventable through early diagnosis and treatment with a galactose-restricted diet. Vision may be severely compromised and the disorder Aniridia is a condition characterized by the absence or near absence of the iris, the colored,

muscular ring in the eye that controls the size of the pupil and regulates the amount of light entering the eye. Vision may be severely compromised and the disorder is frequently associated with several other ocular complications, including nystagmus, amblyopia, buphthalmos, and cataract. affecting multiple parts of the eye, with macular and optic nerve hypoplasia, cataract, and corneal changes. Aniridia can be congenital, typically affecting both eyes, or caused by a penetrant injury. This absence results in a primarily black appearance of the central eye.
