The bacteria are spread to humans through animal urine or feces, or water or soil contaminated with animal urine and feces, coming into contact with the eyes, mouth, or nose, or breaks in the skin. In developing countries, the disease occurs most commonly in pest control, farmers, and low-income people who live in areas with poor sanitation. DPT vaccine Common side effects include soreness where the shot was given, fever, irritability, tenderness, loss of appetite, and vomiting. Most side effects are mild The DPT vaccine or DTP vaccine is a class of combination vaccines to protect against three infectious diseases in humans: diphtheria, pertussis (whooping cough), and tetanus (lockjaw). The vaccine components include diphtheria and tetanus toxoids, and either killed whole cells of the bacterium that causes pertussis or pertussis antigens. The whole cells or antigens will be depicted as either "DTwP" or "DTaP", where the lower-case "w" indicates whole-cell inactivated pertussis and the lower-case "a" stands for "acellular". In this way, the toxoid vaccine generates an immune response which is targeted against the toxin which is produced by the pathogen and causes disease, rather than a vaccine which is targeted against the pathogen itself. The term toxoid refers to vaccines which use an inactivated toxin produced by the pathogen which they are targeted against to generate an immune response. In comparison to alternative vaccine types, such as live attenuated vaccines, the DTP vaccine does not contain any live pathogen, but rather uses inactivated toxoid (and for pertussis, either a dead pathogen or pure antigens) to generate an immune response; therefore, there is not a risk of use in

Childhood immunizations in the United States The schedule includes vaccines of several different types against viral and bacterial infections including hepatitis B, rotavirus, diphtheria, tetanus, pertussis, *Haemophilus influenzae* type b, pneumococcal disease, polio, influenza, varicella, hepatitis A, measles, mumps, rubella, meningococcal disease, and human papillomavirus. Common adverse reactions to vaccines. Routine childhood vaccination in the US was disrupted during the COVID-19 pandemic, but immunization rates returned to near pre-pandemic levels by 2024. The schedule for childhood immunizations in the United States (US) is published and routinely updated by the Centers for Disease Control and Prevention (CDC). Some side effects of this vaccination include: soreness at injection site (1 in 4 children) fever of 99. The childhood vaccine schedule is designed specifically to deliver protection during periods of greatest vulnerability. Pertussis vaccine There are two main types: whole-cell vaccines and acellular vaccines. Since its introduction, the maternal pertussis immunisation programme has been very effective Pertussis vaccine is a vaccine that protects against whooping cough (pertussis). The effectiveness of the vaccines appears to decrease by between 2 and 10% per year after vaccination, with a more rapid decrease with the acellular vaccines. The vaccine is only available in combination with tetanus and diphtheria vaccines (DPT vaccine). allowed maternal pertussis immunisation from week 16 of pregnancy. Pertussis vaccine is estimated to have saved over 500,000 lives in 2002. The whole-cell vaccine is about 78% effective while the acellular vaccine is 71–85% effective

The diphtheria vaccine is very safe. Significant side effects are rare. Pain may occur at the injection site. A bump may form at the site of injection that lasts a few weeks. The vaccine is safe in both pregnancy and among those who have a poor immune function. The diphtheria vaccine is delivered in several combinations. Some combinations (Td and DT vaccines) include tetanus vaccine, others (known as DPT vaccine or DTaP vaccine depending on the pertussis antigen used) comes with the tetanus and

pertussis vaccines, and still others include additional vaccines such as Hib vaccine, hepatitis B vaccine, or inactivated polio vaccine. The World Health Organization (WHO) has recommended its use since 1974. About 84% of the world... e64b97973c

Mumps vaccine It may cause "slight soreness and swelling" at the site of injection, parotitis and mild fever. The initial dose is recommended between 12 and 18 months of age. Usage after exposure in those not already immune may be useful. More significant side effects Mumps vaccines are vaccines which prevent mumps. Two doses are required for long term prevention. When given to a majority of the population they decrease complications at the population level. Side effects are usually mild. The second dose is then typically given between two years and six years of age. Effectiveness when 90% of a population is vaccinated is estimated at 85% e64b97973c

People with HIV e64b97973c Vaccinating the mother during pregnancy may protect the baby. The World Health Organization and the US Centers for Disease Control and Prevention recommend all children be vaccinated for pertussis and that it be included in routine vaccinations. Three doses starting at six weeks of age are typically recommended in young children. Additional doses may be given to older children and adults. This recommendation includes people who have HIV/AIDS. e64b97973c The combined vaccine is as safe and protective as if given as separate hepatitis A and B vaccines. It is generally well-tolerated. Common side effects are mild and include redness and pain at the injection site, where a small lump may appear. Feeling faint or tired, or a headache may occur. Other side effects include numbness, tingling, rash, bruising, abnormal bleeding such as from the nose or gums, weak muscle or pain. Hepatitis A vaccine The first hepatitis A vaccine was approved in the European Union in 1991, and the United States in 1995. Pain at the site of injection occurs in about 15% of children Hepatitis A vaccine is a vaccine that prevents hepatitis A. Severe side effects are very rare. It is on the World Health Organization's List of Essential Medicines. It is effective in around 95% of cases and lasts for at least twenty years and possibly a person's entire life. Diphtheria vaccine Three further doses are recommended during childhood. The first dose is recommended at six weeks of age with two additional doses four weeks apart, after which it is about 95% effective during childhood. Severe adverse effects of DTP Diphtheria vaccine is a toxoid vaccine against diphtheria, an illness caused by *Corynebacterium diphtheriae*. It is unclear if further doses later in life are needed. Its use resulted in a more than 90% decrease in the number of cases globally between 1980 and 2000. adverse effects such as fever, irritability, drowsiness, loss of appetite, and, in 6–13% of vaccine recipients, vomiting e64b97973c

== Administration schedule == e64b97973c Side effects are usually mild. It may cause "slight soreness and swelling" at the site of injection, parotitis and mild fever. More significant side effects are rare. Evidence is insufficient to link the vaccine to complications such as neurological effects (beyond "occasional orchitis and sensorineural deafness"). The vaccine should not be given to people who are pregnant or have very poor immune system function. Poor outcomes among children of mothers who received the vaccine during pregnancy, however, have not been documented. Even though the vaccine is developed in chicken cells, it is generally safe to give to those with egg allergies. e64b97973c The World Health Organization (WHO) recommends universal vaccination in areas where the disease is moderately common.
