Between 2015 and 2020, only about 44% of infants worldwide were exclusively breastfed in the first six months of life. Management of dehydration Management of dehydration (or rehydration) seeks to reverse dehydration by replenishing the lost water and electrolytes. Water and electrolytes can be given through a number of routes, including oral, intravenous, and rectal.
