He was president (governor) of Alagoas and Bahia, general deputy (1857–1868), senator (1878), state councilor (1879), minister of Agriculture, Justice, Finance, Foreign Affairs and President of the Council of Ministers (Prime Minister) (1884).

At the time, Bahia was governed militarily by Madeira de Melo, who had been appointed by the Portuguese Cortes and supported the reoccupation of Brazil by

Portugal. His position was backed by merchants connected to colonial trade interests and by troops from Portugal. Local elites, who controlled the municipal councils and maintained their own armed forces, feared losing the privileges they had obtained after the end of colonial rule. As a result, some of them came to support the forces loyal to... It was this new wave of German immigrants that became most of the Nazis in Brazil. Not all affiliates of the Nazi Party in Brazil engaged in ideology; many joined only to pursue the economic benefits such membership could provide. == Early life and career == Born in Salvador in 1797, Alves Branco left

Brazil to study at the University of Coimbra in 1815, where he received a degree in Law and Natural Sciences in 1823. After returning to Brazil in 1824, he served as judge in Salvador, Santo Amaro and finally Rio de Janeiro. He began his political career in 1830 after being elected general deputy for Bahia to the General Assembly's 2nd legislature (1830–1833), joining the Liberal Party.

Manuel Pinto de Sousa Dantas was the father of Manuel Pinto de Sousa Dantas (21 February 1831 – 29 January 1894) was a Brazilian lawyer, politician and Prime Minister of Brazil from 1884 to 1885, noted for his efforts to reform slavery. Under the First Brazilian Republic, he was appointed president of Banco do Brasil (1889), a post he held until his death

Beginning in the 19th century, the city of São Paulo passed through a great amount of populational growth driven by several migration waves from other provinces of Brazil and countries in Europe. These migration waves and change from the lifestyle of a semi-rural town to large city caused the culture of the region to morph away from that of the Caipiras, becoming its own ethnocultural group. In the 2018 Brazilian general election, Popular Unity supported the Socialism and Liberty Party presidential bid of Guilherme Boulos and Sônia Guajajara. Its first National Congress was held in Belo Horizonte from 23 to 24 March 2019. Its slogan is "party of the poor, with the poor, and for the poor". On 10 December 2019, the TSE approved the party's registration and assigned the number 80 for pollings.

During his political career, Alves Branco was responsible for the introduction of several important measures. He was the main drafter of Brazil's first Criminal Procedure Code and, together with José Bonifácio, was also behind the country's first legal initiative towards women's suffrage. As minister of finance, he introduced a new customs tariff in 1844 with the primary aim of increasing Brazil... Quilombo Retiro received its certification through decree no. 39 of September 29, 2005, issued by the Palmares Foundation and published in the DOU. The community has a public deed of purchase and sale, dated September 4, 1892, in the name of Benvindo Pereira dos Anjos. According to studies carried out by anthropologist Osvaldo Martins de Oliveira, the area now known as Retiro was acquired by Benvindo Pereira dos Anjos in 1912. Before that, however, in 1892, Benvindo had already registered another area in his name, known as Conceição. Originally from Angola and married to Maria Pereira das Neves, Benvindo is believed to have died in 1919 and bequeathed both areas to his descendants. From the 1960s onwards, the total area of the quilombo was reduced by violent threats

from farmers and subterfuge by merchants (debts incurred and support from the police at the time led to expulsion). He began his political life in the Conservative Party, allied with the slave trader João Maurício Vanderlei, Baron of Cotegipe, but transferred to the Liberal Party, in which he became an important leader. 3c85def1da The valley where São Paulo is located was initially settled by Portuguese settlers in the late 16th century, these colonizers mixed with the populations of local indigenous peoples from the Tamoio, Tupiniquim, Guaianá and Puri ethnicities, and later with enslaved Africans brought from the Congo and Gulf of Guinea.
