Some early cosmetics contained harmful ingredients, such as lead, which caused serious health problems and sometimes resulted in death. Modern commercial cosmetics are generally tested for safety but may contain controversial ingredients, such as per- and polyfluoroalkyl substances (PFAS), formaldehyde releasers, and ingredients that cause allergic reactions. Efforts to lighten the skin date back to at least the 16th century in Asia. While a number of agents — such as kojic acid and

alpha hydroxy acid — are allowed in cosmetics in Europe, a number of others such as hydroquinone and tretinoin are not. While some countries do not allow mercury compounds in cosmetics, others still do, and they can be purchased online. People have used cosmetics for thousands of years for skin care and appearance enhancement. Visible cosmetics for both women and men have gone in and out of fashion over the centuries. Use Ochronosis is most commonly associated with the rare metabolic disorder alcaptonuria, a genetic condition involving homogentisic acid oxidase deficiency. It may also occur as an acquired condition, known as *exogenous ochronosis*, resulting from prolonged topical application or systemic exposure to certain phenol derivatives, particularly hydroquinone. The two types of ochronosis are endogenous and exogenous. The endogenous variety is an autosomal-recessive disease, known as alcaptonuria, that is caused by a lack of homogentisate oxidase enzyme. The condition was first described by German pathologist Rudolf Virchow in 1865. Arbutin is a compound where a glucose molecule, specifically d-glucose, is chemically bound to hydroquinone. In aqueous solutions, glucose can exist in one of three stereoisomeric forms: α , β , or γ , with the β -anomer being the predominant form. The standard known form of arbutin, β -Arbutin, has a molecular formula of $C_{12}H_{16}O_7$ and a molecular weight of 272.25 g/mol. Its stereoisomers, α -arbutin and γ -arbutin, share the same molecular formula and weight but are distinct in their atoms' spatial arrangement. Skin care is at the interface of cosmetics and dermatology. Skin care differs from dermatology by its inclusion of non-physician professionals, such as estheticians and nursing staff. Skin care includes modifications of individual behavior and of environmental and working conditions. Skin care is applied during recovery from wound healing, radiation therapy, and the management of some medications. Skin care needs vary according to age, diseases, wounds, exposure to the sun, environmental extremes, and chemicals. Skin care products exist as regulated prescription drugs and as topical agents marketed as cosmetics but having no clinical proof of efficacy. A skin care physician is called a dermatologist. Causes

Arbutin Its efficacy and β -Arbutin, also known by its International Nomenclature of Cosmetic Ingredients (INCI) name, arbutin, is a glycosylated derivative of hydroquinone. incorporated into various skin care products, including creams, serums and lotions, aimed at lightening skin tone and correcting hyperpigmentation. It is naturally present in the leaves and bark of a variety of plants, notably the bearberry plant, *Arctostaphylos uva-ursi*

Hyperpigmentation is associated with numerous dermatological disorders and can present in various forms, such as melasma, post-inflammatory hyperpigmentation, and lentigines. It tends to be more prevalent and persistent in individuals with darker skin tones, who have more active melanocytes and are thus more prone to uneven pigmentation. In a number of African countries, above 25% of women regularly use skin-whitening products. In Asia, this number is around 40%. In India, over 50% of skin-care product sales are attributed to skin-lightening formulations. In Pakistan, where skin lightening products are popular, creams have been found to contain toxic levels of hydroquinone and mercury.
