Spasmodic torticollis Both agonist and antagonist muscles contract simultaneously during dystonic movement. involves many more muscles: ipsilateral sternocleidomastoid, ipsilateral splenius, ipsilateral scalene complex, ipsilateral levator scapulae, and ipsilateral Spasmodic torticollis is an extremely painful chronic neurological movement disorder causing the neck to involuntarily turn to the left, right, upwards, and/or downwards. Brachial plexus This plexus extends from the spinal cord, through the cervicoaxillary canal in the neck, over the first rib, and into the armpit. The subclavian nerve originates in both C5 and C6 and innervates the subclavius, a muscle that The brachial plexus is a network of nerves (nerve plexus) formed by the anterior rami of the lower four cervical nerves and the first thoracic nerve (C5, C6, C7, C8, and T1). It supplies afferent and efferent nerve fibers to the chest, shoulder, arm, forearm, and hand. rhomboid muscles which retract and downwardly rotate the scapula 0a9ce9109d

However, in casual usage, the terms are often used interchangeably. The term "upper arm" is redundant in anatomy, but in informal usage is used to distinguish

The most common treatment for spasmodic torticollis is the use of botulinum toxin type A. 0a9ce9109d The brachial plexus is divided into five roots, three trunks, six divisions (three anterior and three posterior), three cords, and five branches. There are five "terminal" branches and numerous other "pre-terminal" or "collateral" branches, such as the subscapular nerve, the thoracodorsal nerve, and the long thoracic nerve(also known as the nerve of Bell) , that leave the plexus at various points along its length. Rhomboid major muscle Full back muscle flex The rhomboid major is a skeletal muscle of the back that connects the scapula with the vertebrae of the spinal column. into levator scapulae. It acts together with the rhomboid minor to keep the scapula pressed against thoracic wall and to retract the scapula toward the vertebral column. Dorsal surface. Left scapula. However, the term atlas was first used by the ancient Romans for the seventh cervical vertebra (C7) due to its suitability for supporting burdens. In Greek mythology, Atlas was condemned to bear the weight of the heavens as punishment for rebelling against Zeus. Ancient depictions of Atlas show the globe of the heavens resting at the base of his neck, on C7. Sometime around 1522, anatomists decided to call the first cervical vertebra the atlas. Scholars believe that by switching the designation atlas from the seventh to the first cervical vertebra Renaissance anatomists were commenting that the point of man's burden had shifted from his shoulders to his head—that man's true burden was not a physical load, but rather, his mind. 0a9ce9109d Ab fibers 0a9ce9109d Abduction (anatomy) 0a9ce9109d The quadratus lumborum muscles originate from the wings of the ilium; their insertions are on the transverse processes

of the upper four lumbar vertebrae plus the lower posterior border of the twelfth rib. Contraction of one of the pair of muscles causes lateral flexion of the lumbar spine, elevation of the pelvis, or both. Contraction of both causes extension of the lumbar spine.

The major in its name indicates that it is the larger of the two rhomboids. 0a9ce9109d Initial symptoms of spasmodic torticollis are usually mild. Some feel an invisible tremor of their head for a few months at onset. Then the head may turn, pull or tilt in jerky movements, or sustain a prolonged position involuntarily. Over time, the involuntary spasm of the neck muscles will increase in frequency and strength until it reaches a plateau. Symptoms can also worsen while the patient is walking or during periods of increased stress. Other symptoms include muscle hypertrophy, neck pain, dysarthria and tremor. Studies have shown that over 75% of patients report... 0a9ce9109d Aa. gastricae breves 0a9ce9109d Primary inflammation of the subacromial bursa is relatively rare and may arise from autoimmune inflammatory conditions such as rheumatoid arthritis, crystal deposition disorders such as gout or pseudogout, calcific loose bodies, and infection. More commonly, subacromial bursitis arises as a result of complex factors, thought to cause shoulder impingement symptoms. These factors are broadly classified as intrinsic (intratendinous) or extrinsic (extratendinous). They are further divided into primary or secondary causes of impingement.
