The Golden Cross Mine closed in 1920 but reopened from 1991 to 1998. The Martha Mine closed in 1952 but reopened in 1987 and is still operating. History of discovery The first gold rush in Australia began in May 1851 after prospector Edward Hargraves claimed to have discovered payable gold near Orange, at a site called Ophir. Hargraves had been to the California goldfields and had learned new gold prospecting techniques such as panning and cradling. Hargraves was offered rewards by the Colony of New South Wales and the Colony of Victoria. Before the end of the year, the gold rush had spread to many other parts of the state where... Gold was discovered in 1848 at Sutter's Mill in El Dorado County, triggering the California gold rush and drawing prospectors known as the 49ers. Approximately 500 mining camps were established across the region. Between 1849 and 1855, an estimated \$400 million in gold was extracted through methods including placer mining, hard-rock mining, and hydraulic mining. Most mines shut down in 1942 under War Production Board order L-208 during World War II. A group... California State Route 49, named for the 49ers, is the primary highway through the region. The Lapland gold rush started in the valley of the Ivalo River in 1870 and lasted for a few years. Lapland date back to the early 16th century, when gold was discovered from Utsjoki, but its presence was not widely known until the 19th century. Although the scale of the Lapland gold rush is not comparable to the major 19th century gold rushes, the Lapland gold rush has great local significance in Lapland and across Finland

Many Georgia miners moved west when gold was found in the Sierra Nevada in 1848, starting the California Gold Rush. It started in 1829 in present-day Lumpkin County near the county seat, Dahlonega, and soon spread through the North Georgia mountains, following the Georgia Gold Belt. Since the 16th century, American Indians in Georgia told European explorers that the small amounts of gold which they possessed came from mountains of the interior. In summing up known sources, W. S. Some poorly documented accounts exist of Spanish or French mining gold in North Georgia between 1560 and 1690, but they are based on supposition and on rumors passed on by Indians

In 1695, at Rio das Velhas, Manuel Borba Gato discovered gold, leading to the gold rush. In 1698, Vila Rica (later Ouro Preto) was established, becoming the capital of Minas Gerais from 1720 to 1897. In 1697, the Estrada Real was established by the crown to promote development of the interior, reaching from the coast through Ouro Preto onwards to Diamantina. To reach the gold fields, most prospectors took the route through the ports of Dyea and Skagway in southeast Alaska. Here, the "Klondikers" could follow either the Chilkoot or White Pass trail to the Yukon River and sail down to the Klondike. The Canadian authorities required each person to bring a year's supply of food in order to prevent starvation. In all, the Klondikers' equipment weighed close to a ton, which most carried themselves in stages. Performing this task and

contending with the mountainous terrain and cold climate meant that most of those who persisted did not arrive until the summer of 1898. Most of the gold was in quartz reefs rather than in more accessible alluvial deposits and had to be recovered from underground mines and extracted using stamping batteries. The Waihi Mine had been discovered in 1878, but was not seriously worked until 1887, when English capital The Coromandel Gold Rushes on the Coromandel Peninsula and around the nearby towns of Thames and Waihi in New Zealand in the nineteenth century were moderately successful. But Thames acquired a reputation for speculative holding of unworked ground despite regulations designed to check it, and some miners left for Queensland. While gold mining itself proved unprofitable for most diggers and mine owners, some people amassed fortunes, and merchants and transportation facilities made large profits. The resulting increase in the world's gold supply stimulated global trade and investment. Gold was discovered there by local miners on August 16, 1896; when news reached Seattle and San Francisco the following year, it triggered a stampede of prospectors.
