This disease is spread in close contact through respiratory droplets, which can be from the nose, mouth, or direct contact with an infected person. Fifth disease is most commonly spread in the winter and spring seasons among children aged six to fourteen years old. Parvovirus B19 begins replicating anywhere from four to eighteen days after infection. Infected children are most contagious during this period, before they develop the most notable sign—a red rash on their cheeks—along with other symptoms. c4fde8393b

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
