Pain can vary from a dull constant ache to a sudden sharp feeling. The symptoms of low back pain usually improve within a few weeks from the time they start, with 40–90% of people recovered by six weeks. beneficial for those with disc-related chronic pain and disability or spinal stenosis. Low back pain may be classified by duration as acute (pain lasting less than 6 weeks), sub-acute (6 to 12 weeks), or chronic (more than 12 weeks) c570b10277

Valsalva maneuver Variations of the maneuver may be used either in medical examination as a test of cardiac function and autonomic nervous control of the heart (because the maneuver raises the pressure in the lungs), or to clear the ears and sinuses (that is, to equalize pressure between them) when ambient pressure changes, as in scuba diving, hyperbaric oxygen therapy, or air travel. following certain spinal operations, such as a microdiscectomy. An increase in intra-spinal pressure will cause cerebral spinal fluid (CSF) to leak out of the The Valsalva maneuver is performed by a forceful attempt of exhalation against a closed airway, usually done by closing one's mouth and pinching one's nose shut while expelling air, as if blowing up a balloon c570b10277

Back pain An episode of back pain may be acute, subacute or chronic depending on the duration. The pain may be characterized as a dull ache, shooting or piercing pain or a burning sensation. Discomfort can radiate to the arms and hands as well as the legs or feet, and may

include numbness or weakness in the legs and arms. It may be classified as neck pain (cervical), middle back pain (thoracic), lower back pain (lumbar) or coccydynia (tailbone or sacral pain) based on the segment affected. It is associated with age-related degenerative changes as well as trauma and congenital anomalies. compared to the neighboring vertebra. EMG is performed using an instrument called an electromyograph to produce a record called an electromyogram. An electromyograph detects the electric potential generated by muscle cells when these cells are electrically or neurologically activated. Spondylosis If severe, it may cause pressure on the spinal cord or nerve roots with subsequent sensory or motor disturbances, such as pain, paresthesia, imbalance, and muscle weakness in the limbs. The degenerative process in osteoarthritis chiefly affects the vertebral

bodies, the neural foramina and the facet joints (facet syndrome). In the more narrow sense, it refers to spinal osteoarthritis, the age-related degeneration of the spinal column, which is the most common cause of spondylosis. Congenital cervical spine stenosis commonly occurs due to short pedicles (that Spondylosis is the degeneration of the vertebral column from any cause. osteophytes may cause stenosis for spinal nerves, manifesting as radiculopathy c570b10277

The technique is named after Antonio Maria Valsalva, a seventeenth-century physician and anatomist from Bologna whose principal scientific interest was the human ear. He described the eustachian tube and the maneuver to test its patency (openness). c570b10277

The main Obstructed defecation syndrome (abbreviated as ODS, with many synonymous terms) is a major cause of functional constipation (primary constipation), of which it is considered a subtype. It is characterized by difficult and/or incomplete emptying of the rectum with or without reduction in the frequency of bowel movements. Functional anal stenosis disappears under anesthesia, whereas true anal stenosis does not. Normal definitions of functional constipation include infrequent bowel movements and hard stools. e. a functional disorder) c570b10277

== Signs and symptoms == c570b10277 CES is generally treated surgically via laminectomy. Sudden onset is regarded as a medical emergency requiring prompt surgical decompression, with delay causing permanent loss of function. Permanent bladder problems, sexual dysfunction or numbness may occur despite surgery. A poor outcome occurs in about 20% of people despite treatment. About 1 in 70,000 people are affected every year. It was first described in 1934. c570b10277 == Differential diagnosis == c570b10277 Signs and symptoms of cauda equina syndrome include: c570b10277 Disc herniation is frequently associated with age-related degeneration of the outer ring, known as the annulus fibrosus, but is normally triggered by trauma or straining by lifting or twisting.

Tears are almost always posterolateral (on the back sides) owing to relative narrowness of the posterior longitudinal ligament relative to the anterior longitudinal ligament. A tear in the disc ring may result in the release of chemicals causing inflammation, which can result in... c570b10277 In most episodes of low back pain a specific underlying cause is not identified or even looked for: the pain is believed to be due to mechanical problems such as muscle or joint strain. If the pain does not go away with conservative treatment or if it is accompanied by "red flag" symptoms such as unexplained weight loss, fever, or significant problems with feeling or movement, further testing may be needed to look for a serious underlying problem. In most cases, imaging tools such as CT scans are not useful or recommended for low back pain that lasts less than 6 weeks (with no red flags) and carry their own risks. Some low back pain is caused by damaged intervertebral... c570b10277 == History == c570b10277 In majority of cases, spondylolysis presents asymptotically, which can make diagnosis both difficult and incidental. When a patient does present with symptoms, there are general signs and symptoms a clinician will look for: c570b10277 When the space between two adjacent vertebrae narrows, compression of a nerve root emerging from the spinal cord may result in radiculopathy. Radiculopathy is characterized by sensory and motor disturbances, such as severe pain in the neck, shoulder, arm, back, or leg, accompanied by muscle weakness. Less commonly, direct pressure on the spinal cord (typically in the cervical spine) may result in myelopathy, characterized by global weakness, gait dysfunction, loss of balance, and loss of bowel or bladder control. The patient may experience shocks (paresthesia) in hands and legs because of nerve compression and lack of blood flow. Disc herniation It may result in back pain, pain or abnormal sensation in different parts of the body, and physical disability. The risk of disc herniation may be reduced by maintaining core strength and an awareness of body mechanics including good posture. The most conclusive diagnostic tool for disc herniation is MRI,

and treatments may range from painkillers to surgery. In addition to causing pain and inflammation, TNF may contribute to disc degeneration. The vast majority of cases occur in the lower lumbar vertebrae (L5), but spondylolysis may also occur in the cervical vertebrae. incisions and has a high success rate. When a tear in the outer, fibrous ring of an intervertebral disc allows the soft, central portion to bulge out beyond the damaged outer rings, the disc is said to be herniated. c570b10277 The majority of back pain is nonspecific and idiopathic. Common underlying mechanisms include degenerative or traumatic changes to the discs and facet joints, which can then cause secondary pain in the muscles and nerves and referred pain to the bones, joints and extremities. Diseases and inflammation of the gallbladder, pancreas, aorta and kidneys may also cause referred pain in the back. Tumors of the vertebrae, neural tissues and adjacent structures can also manifest as back pain. c570b10277 The head is supported by the lower neck and upper back, and it is these areas that commonly cause neck pain. If this support system is affected adversely, then the muscles in the area will tighten, leading to neck pain. c570b10277 Saddle anesthesia (see diagram), i.e., anesthesia or paraesthesia involving S3 to S5 dermatomes... c570b10277 Because there is not a universally accepted classification for neck pain, it is difficult to study the different types of pain. In 2020, neck pain was the

second most common cause of disability in the United States and cost \$100 billion in health care spending. c570b10277 Nightly rotator cuff impingement may lead to an asymptomatic shoulder impingement, leading to neck pain. == Signs and symptoms == c570b10277 The cause is usually a disc herniation in the lower region of the back. Other causes include spinal stenosis, cancer, trauma, epidural abscess, and epidural hematoma.
