It is not a diagnosis but is a symptom of some mental disorders, use of certain psychoactive drugs, and can also occur in response to adverse life circumstances without the presence of a mental disorder

There are three versions of the BDI—the original BDI, first published in 1961 and later revised in 1978 as the BDI-1A, and the BDI-II, published in 1996. The BDI is widely used as an assessment tool by health care professionals and researchers in a variety of settings. The HRSD has been criticized for use in clinical practice as it places more emphasis on insomnia than on feelings of hopelessness, self-destructive thoughts, suicidal cognitions and actions. An antidepressant may show statistical efficacy even when thoughts of suicide increase but sleep is improved, or for that matter, an antidepressant that as a side effect increases sexual and gastrointestinal symptom ratings may register as being less effective in treating the depression itself than it actually is. Hamilton maintained that his scale should not be used as a diagnostic instrument. The original 1960

Beck Depression Inventory Beck drew attention to the importance The Beck Depression Inventory (BDI, BDI-1A, BDI-II), created by Aaron T. their symptoms and then using these to structure a scale which could reflect the intensity or severity of a given symptom. Beck, is a 21-question multiple-choice self-report inventory, one of the most widely used psychometric tests for measuring the severity of depression. Its development marked a shift among mental health professionals who had, until then, viewed depression from a psychodynamic perspective, instead of it being rooted in the patient's own thoughts 8ec8dab2af

The methodology of suicide risk assessment is to identify warning signs, contributing factors (e.g., mental illness, prior attempts), and protective factors (e.g., family support). However, suicide is a statistically rare event influenced by multiple interacting variables, which makes reliable prediction difficult. 8ec8dab2af Patients are asked about "general non-specific thoughts of wanting to end one's life/complete suicide" and if they have had "...thoughts of suicide and have thought of at least one method during the assessment period." Patients are asked if they have "active suicidal thoughts of killing oneself...[and]

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any intent to act on such thoughts." They are asked how frequently they have these thoughts, how long the thoughts last and... Interest in a quantifiable global rating of functioning dates back to as early as 1962 with the publication of the Health-Sickness Rating Scale (which was rated 0 to 100) by Luborsky et al. in the paper "Clinicians' Judgements of Mental Health". This was subsequently revised in 1976 as the Global Assessment Scale (GAS) in the paper "The Global Assessment Scale: Procedure for Measuring Overall Severity of Psychiatric Disturbance" by... The scale was included in the Diagnostic and Statistical Manual of Mental Disorders (DSM) version 4 (DSM-IV), but replaced in DSM-5 with the World Health Organization Disability Assessment Timetable (WHODAT), a survey or interview with detailed items. The WHODAT is considered more detailed and objective than a single global impression. The main advantage of the GAF is its brevity. Cause and development == Scales completed by clinicians, researchers, and workers == The GAD-7 is normally used in outpatient and primary care settings for referral to a psychiatrist pending outcome. A systematic review compared screening tools and concluded that the GAD-7 is the most efficient one for identifying GAD as well as panic disorders in primary care populations. The BDI was used as a model for the development of the Children's Depression Inventory (CDI), first published in 1979 by clinical psychologist Maria Kovacs.

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Hamilton Rating Scale for Depression Max Hamilton originally published the scale in 1960 and revised it in 1966, 1967, 1969, and 1980. Occurrence is rare, only affecting a small percentage of the population; risk factors include being light skinned, or at high elevation. An individual exhibiting even a single behavior identified by the scale was 8 to 10 times more likely to die by suicide. The scale identifies specific behaviors which may be indicative of an individual's intent to kill oneself. In its current version, the BDI-II is designed for individuals aged 13 and over, and is composed of items relating to symptoms of depression such as hopelessness and irritability, cognitions such as guilt or feelings of being punished, as well as physical symptoms such as fatigue, weight loss, and lack of interest in sex. 8ec8dab2af

Rating scales for depression Several rating scales are used for this purpose. Rather than being used to diagnose depression, a depression rating scale may be used to assign a score to a person's behaviour where that score may be used to determine whether that person should be evaluated more thoroughly for a depressive disorder diagnosis. When used, an observer may make judgements and rate a person at a specified scale level with respect to identified characteristics. 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Depression A depression rating scale is a psychometric instrument (tool), usually a questionnaire whose wording has been validated with experimental evidence, having descriptive words and phrases that indicate the severity of depression for a time period

While underreported in mainstream medical contexts, individuals with self-diagnosed Hell's itch claim it to be distinct from a regular sunburn; Hell's itch is triggered by treatments that would otherwise be soothing to a standard sunburn, such as the application of cold compresses or topical creams.

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suicide attempts, but suicidal thoughts are considered a risk factor. During 2008–09, an estimated 8.3 million adults aged 18 and over in the United States, or 3.7% of the adult U.S. population, reported having suicidal thoughts in the previous year, while an estimated 2.2 million reported having made suicide plans in the previous year. In 2019, 12 million U.S. adults seriously thought about suicide, 3.5 million planned a suicide attempt, 1.4 million attempted suicide, and more than 47,500 died by suicide.
