Hypnotic Some hypnotics are also used to treat narcolepsy and hypersomnia by improving sleep at night and thereby reducing daytime sleepiness. Certain hypnotics can be used to treat non-restorative sleep and associated symptoms in conditions like fibromyalgia as well. Examples include zopiclone (Imovane), eszopiclone (Lunesta), zaleplon (Sonata), and zolpidem (Ambien). Eszopiclone's primary mechanism of action involves enhancing the natural effect of GABA receptors by acting as a positive allosteric modulator on GABA-A expressing neurons. Common side effects include headache, dry mouth, nausea, and dizziness. Severe side effects may include suicidal thoughts, hallucinations, and angioedema. Rapid decreasing of the dose may result in withdrawal. Eszopiclone is classified as a nonbenzodiazepine or Z-drug and a sedative and hypnotic of the cyclopyrrolone group. Benzodiazepine-like drugs decrease sleep latency by 10 to 20 minutes. However, no benzodiazepine-like drug has shown clinically significant increase in total sleep time. Zopiclone is recommended only to be taken at the lowest effective dose, with a duration of 2–3 weeks, for short-term insomnia. One enantiomer of a drug may have a desired beneficial effect while the other may cause serious and undesired side effects, or sometimes even beneficial but entirely different effects. The desired enantiomer of a given drug is known as the eutomer while the undesired enantiomer is known as the distomer. When equal amounts of both enantiomers are found in a

mixture, the mixture is known as a racemic mixture. Zopiclone Within days to weeks, the body can become accustomed to the effects of zopiclone. The risk of developing tolerance with benzodiazepine-like drugs is comparable to benzodiazepines. Zopiclone is considered a sedative and CNS depressant. Massachusetts, began marketing the active stereoisomer eszopiclone under the name Lunesta in the United States. When the dose is then reduced or the drug is abruptly stopped, withdrawal symptoms similar to those of benzodiazepine withdrawal may result. Zopiclone and other benzodiazepine-like drugs like zaleplon and zolpidem are addictive.
