They live mostly in solitude, hunt alone, and usually do not spin webs. Some are opportunistic hunters, pouncing upon prey as they find it or chasing it over short distances; others wait for passing prey in or near the mouth of a burrow. Efforts to prevent bites include clearing clutter and the use of pesticides. Most spider bites are managed with supportive care such as nonsteroidal anti-inflammatory drugs (including ibuprofen) for pain and antihistamines for itchiness...

Two of the wolf spider's eight eyes are large and prominent; this distinguishes them from nursery web spiders, whose eyes are all of roughly equal size. This can also help distinguish them from the similar-looking grass spiders. e83b06523f Anatomically, spiders (as with all arachnids) differ from other arthropods in that the usual body segments are fused into two tagmata, the cephalothorax or prosoma, and the opisthosoma, or abdomen, and joined by a small, cylindrical pedicel. However, as there is currently neither paleontological nor embryological evidence that spiders ever had a separate thorax-like division, there exists an argument against the validity of the term cephalothorax, which means fused cephalon (head) and the thorax. The species was first described in 1802 by naturalist Charles Athanase Walckenaer as *Aranea agrestis*, in reference to its western European habitat in fields, woods, and under rocks. In 1841, Walckenaer transferred the species to the genus *Tegenaria*. In 2013, *Tegenaria* was split up, and the hobo spider was transferred to a new genus *Eratigena*, an anagram of *Tegenaria*. They prefer mesic habitats, and are most commonly seen in the springtime, presumably as they are searching for mates as the weather warms. Generally, *C. captiosus* can be found in both oak and pine trees, leaf litter, and caves. *Ctenus captiosus* has also appeared in large numbers in Medical reports have been criticized for poor evidence. Only ten genera (*Atrax*, *Phoneutria*, *Loxosceles*, *Latrodectus*, *Hadronyche*, *Macrothele*, *Missulena*, *Illawarra*, *Sicarius*, and *Hexophthalma*) are considered medically significant. Bites of these spiders have a range of severity, with only a minority having severe symptoms. Deaths by verified spider bites are exceedingly rare (e.g. not one in Australia since 1979). Individuals construct a funnel-shaped structure of silk sheeting and lie in wait at the small end of the funnel for prey insects to blunder onto their webs. Hobo spiders sometimes build their webs in or around human habitations. is no evidence that hobo spider bites cause skin necrosis. Spider As of January 2026, 53,680 spider species in 139 families have been recorded by taxonomists. However, there has been debate among scientists about how families should be classified, with over 20 different classifications proposed since 1900. reported deaths from spider bites in the 20th century, compared to about 1,500 from jellyfish stings. They are the largest order of arachnids and rank seventh in total species diversity among all orders of organisms. Spiders are found worldwide on every continent except Antarctica, and have become established in nearly every land habitat. Many alleged cases of spider bites may represent incorrect Spiders (order Araneae) are air-breathing arthropods that have eight limbs, chelicerae with fangs generally able to inject venom, and spinnerets that extrude silk e83b06523f

== Taxonomy == e83b06523f They are reported to bite humans, with effects including a red mark, and local itchiness, swelling and pain. On rare occasions, bites can cause nausea, vomiting, malaise or headache. Although ulcers and necrosis have been attributed to the bites, a scientific study by Isbister and Gray (2003) showed they had other causes, mostly infections. A study of 130 white-tailed spider bites found no necrotic ulcers or confirmed infections. e83b06523f

== Description == e83b06523f Most spiders do not cause bites that are of importance. For a bite to be significant, substantial envenomation is required. Bites from the widow spiders involve a neurotoxic venom which produces a condition known as latrodectism. Symptoms may include pain which may be at the bite or involve the chest and abdomen, sweating, muscle cramps and vomiting among others. Bites from the recluse spiders cause the condition loxoscelism, in which local necrosis of the surrounding skin and widespread breakdown of red blood cells may occur. Headaches, vomiting and a mild fever may also occur. Other spiders that can cause

significant bites include the Australian funnel-web spider and South American wandering spider. e83b06523f White-tailed spiders are vagrant hunters that seek out and envenom prey rather than spinning a web to capture it; their preferred prey is other spiders. e83b06523f Loxoscelism was first described in the United States in 1879 in Tennessee. Although there are up to 13 different *Loxosceles* species in North America (11 native and two non-native), *Loxosceles reclusa*, also known as the Brown Recluse, Fiddleback, or Violin spider, is the species most often involved in serious envenomation. *L. reclusa* has a limited habitat that includes the Southeast United States. In South America, *L. laeta*, *L. intermedia* (found in Brazil and Argentina), and *L. gaucho* (Brazil) are the three species most often reported to cause necrotic bites. e83b06523f

Loxoscelism As of 2006, it was the only proven type of necrotic arachnidism in humans. Because of the number of diseases that may mimic loxoscelism, it is frequently misdiagnosed by physicians. produced by the bite of the recluse spiders (genus *Loxosceles*). While there is no known therapy effective for loxoscelism, there has been research on antibiotics, surgical timing, hyperbaric oxygen, potential antivenoms and vaccines. The abdomen is a yellow-gray except for a pale median band consisting of a series of connected triangles edged by brown. White-tailed spider In White-tailed spiders are spiders native to southern and eastern Australia, with the name referring to the whitish tips at the end of their abdomens. Both the White-tailed spider and the wolf spider were considered as candidates for possibly causing suspected spider bite necrosis in Australia. Common species are *Lampona cylindrata* and *Lampona murina*. The body size is up to 18 mm, with a leg-span of 28 mm. Both these species have been introduced into New Zealand. 1982 e83b06523f

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
