

Citizenship Amendment Act 2019 Pdf

The CAA amends the Indian citizenship act to provide accelerated pathway for citizenship for asylum seeking migrants who are Hindu, Sikh, Jain, Parsi, Buddhist, and Christian from Afghanistan, Bangladesh and Pakistan, and who entered India before 2014, following the religious persecutions. The bill reduced the time taken for naturalization for this category from twelve years to six years. The bill does not mention Muslims and other communities who fled from the same or other neighbouring countries. Refugees from Sri Lankan Tamils in India, Rohingyas from Myanmar, and Tibetan refugees are also not mentioned in the bill. The protest were supported by Indian diaspora worldwide generally against the incumbent Bharatiya Janata Party (BJP) government. The protesters also came in support to Major trade unions opposing the government's anti-labour policies and have protested against recent happenings such as the 2020 JNU Attack. The Shaheen Bagh protests has inspired similar Shaheen Bagh-style protests across the country, such as in Gaya, Park Circus, Prayagraj, Mumbai and Bengaluru.

Citizenship (Amendment) Act, 2019 The eligible minorities were stated as Hindus, Sikhs, Buddhists, Jains, Parsis, and Christians. The act was the first time that religion had been overtly used as a criterion for citizenship under Indian law, and it attracted global criticism. The law does not grant such eligibility to Muslims from these countries, as the Indian government argued that Muslims are unlikely to face religious persecution in Islamic countries.
