In e-liquid formulations, it is safer for humans than synthetic coolants such as WS-23.

Failure to ripen the cervix during labor may delay its onset and cause complications. While sometimes used for nocturnal leg cramps, quinine is not recommended for this purpose due to the risk of serious side effects. Quinine is also used as an ingredient in tonic water and other beverages to impart a bitter taste. It can be taken by mouth or intravenously. This includes the treatment of malaria due to Plasmodium falciparum that is resistant to chloroquine when artesunate is not available. Areca nut He noted the friendly and genial The areca nut, also called betel nut, is the seed of a palm belonging to the areca genus (*Areca catechu*). It is not to be confused with betel (*Piper betle*) leaves that are often used to wrap it. The practice of betel nut chewing, often together with other herbs as a stimulant drug, dates back thousands of years, and continues to the present day in many countries. It is widespread in cultivation and is considered naturalized in much of the tropical Pacific (Melanesia and Micronesia), South Asia, Southeast Asia, and parts of east Africa. The palm is originally native to the Philippines, but was carried widely through the tropics by the Austronesian migrations and trade since at least 1500 BCE due to its use in betel nut chewing.
