Tuberculosis in China After the SARS epidemic was brought under control, the government increased its commitment and leadership to tackle public health problems and, among other efforts, increased public health funding, revised laws that concerned the control of infectious diseases, implemented the world's largest internet-based disease reporting system to improve transparency, reach and speed, and started a program to rebuild local public health facilities and national infrastructure. After the government realized the impact that the SARS outbreak had on the country, they increased leadership in their health department. "Results of directly observed short-course chemotherapy in 112,842 Chinese patients with smear-positive tuberculosis. China has the world's third largest cases of tuberculosis (after India and Indonesia), but progress in tuberculosis control was slow during the 1990s. These signs of inadequate tuberculosis control can be linked to a malfunctioning health system. The spread of severe acute respiratory syndrome (SARS) in 2003, brought to light substantial weaknesses in the country's public health system. (1996). Detection of tuberculosis had stagnated at around 30% of the estimated total of new cases, and multidrug-resistant tuberculosis was a major problem. As of 2023, it is estimated that one-quarter of the world's population has latent or active TB. TB is estimated to have newly infected 10.8 million people per year. a431dd09f4

Diagnosis of tuberculosis when culture results are negative. A 2007 before-after observational study found that use of the MTD test reduced inappropriate tuberculosis therapy. While other investigations may strongly suggest tuberculosis as the diagnosis, they cannot confirm it. The Tuberculosis is diagnosed by finding Mycobacterium tuberculosis bacteria in a clinical specimen taken from the patient a431dd09f4

The medical standard for active TB is a short course treatment involving a combination of isoniazid, rifampicin (also known as Rifampin), pyrazinamide, and ethambutol for the first two months. During this initial period, Isoniazid is taken alongside pyridoxal phosphate to obviate peripheral neuropathy. Isoniazid is then taken concurrently with rifampicin for the remaining four months of treatment (6-8 months for miliary tuberculosis). A patient is expected to be free from all living TB bacteria after six months of therapy in Pulmonary TB or 8-10 months in Miliary TB. a431dd09f4 Tuberculosis is spread from one person to the next through the air when people who have active TB in their lungs cough, spit, speak, or sneeze. People with latent TB do not spread the disease. A latent infection is more likely to become active in individuals with weakened immune systems. There are three principal tests for TB: the interferon-gamma release assay (IGRA), the tuberculin skin test, and the nucleic acid amplification test (NAAT). a431dd09f4 The Heaf test was used to test for tuberculosis in adolescents aged around 13-14. a431dd09f4 The medical history includes obtaining the symptoms of pulmonary TB: productive, prolonged cough of three or more weeks, chest pain, and hemoptysis. Systemic symptoms include low grade remittent fever, chills, night sweats, appetite loss, weight loss, easy fatigability, and production of sputum that starts out mucoid but changes to purulent. Other parts of the medical history include prior TB exposure, infection or disease and medical conditions that increase risk for TB disease such as HIV infection. Depending on the sort of patient population surveyed, as few as 20%, or as many as 75% of pulmonary tuberculosis cases may be without symptoms. a431dd09f4 Latent tuberculosis or latent tuberculosis infection (LTBI) is treated with three to nine months of isoniazid alone. This long-term treatment often risks the development of hepatotoxicity. A combination of isoniazid plus rifampicin for a period of three to four months is shown to be an equally effective method for treating LTBI, while mitigating risks to hepatotoxicity. Treatment of LTBI is essential in preventing the spread of active TB. a431dd09f4

Tuberculosis Infection of other organs can cause a wide range of symptoms. Tuberculosis initially infects the lungs, but it can also spread to other parts of the body. Most infections show no symptoms, in which case tuberculosis is considered to be inactive or latent. For extrapulmonary tuberculosis, molecular WHO-recommended rapid diagnostic tests may be used with Tuberculosis (*tew-BUR-kew-LOH-siss*, also *TEW-bər-*; TB), also known colloquially as the "white death", or historically as consumption, is a contagious disease usually caused by *Mycobacterium tuberculosis* (MTB) bacteria. Typical symptoms of active TB are chronic cough with blood-containing mucus, fever, night sweats, and weight loss. A small proportion of latent

infections progress to active disease that, if left untreated, can be fatal. including false-positive and false-negative results a431dd09f4

== Microbiology == a431dd09f4 The bacteria are curved or straight rods. They sometimes form filaments, which fragment into bacilli or cocci once disturbed. In tissues, they form slender rods, straight or curved, or club-shaped. a431dd09f4

A complete medical evaluation for tuberculosis (TB) must include a medical history, a physical examination, a chest X-ray and microbiological examination (of sputum or some other appropriate sample). It may also include a tuberculin skin test, other scans and X-rays, surgical biopsy. a431dd09f4 The *M. tuberculosis* genome was sequenced in 1998. a431dd09f4 The Heaf test was discontinued in 2005 because the manufacturer deemed its production to be financially unsustainable after manufacturers could not be found for tuberculin or Heaf guns. Until 2005, the test was used in the United Kingdom to determine whether the BCG vaccine was needed; the Mantoux test is now used instead. Latent tuberculosis For LTB, various treatment regimens are used, generally requiring several months for completion. " However Latent tuberculosis (LTB), also called latent tuberculosis infection (LTBI), is a condition that occurs when a person is infected with the bacterium *Mycobacterium tuberculosis* but does not have active tuberculosis (TB). as 90 percent (in patients with positive LTBI test results and fibrotic pulmonary lesions compatible with tuberculosis) if taken daily for 9 months. The active form of the disease can be contagious, while the latent form is not; therefore, it is impossible to catch TB from someone with LTB a431dd09f4

Mantoux test However, additional tests are usually required to confirm active infection. If performed correctly, the injection creates a small, pale bump called a wheal. The test involves injecting a small amount of purified protein derivative (PPD) tuberculin just under the skin of the forearm. The Mantoux test (also called the Mendel-Mantoux test, tuberculin sensitivity test, or PPD test) is a method used to screen for tuberculosis (TB) infection The Mantoux test (also called the Mendel-Mantoux test, tuberculin sensitivity test, or PPD test) is a method used to screen for tuberculosis (TB) infection. The test site is examined a few days later for swelling or hardening of the skin, an immune response that would be expected if the person had been exposed to tuberculosis. It has largely replaced older skin testing techniques such as the tine and Heaf tests a431dd09f4

First discovered in 1882 by Robert Koch, *M. tuberculosis* has an unusual, waxy coating on its cell surface primarily due to the presence of mycolic acid. This coating makes the cells impervious to Gram staining, and as a result, *M. tuberculosis* can appear weakly Gram-positive. Acid-fast stains such as Ziehl-Neelsen, or fluorescent stains such as auramine are used instead to identify *M. tuberculosis* with a microscope. The physiology of *M. tuberculosis* is highly aerobic and requires high levels of oxygen. Primarily a pathogen of the mammalian respiratory system, it infects the lungs. The most frequently used diagnostic methods for tuberculosis are the tuberculin skin test, acid-fast stain, culture, and polymerase chain reaction. a431dd09f4 It is also known as "prosector's wart" because it was a common occupational disease of prosectors, the preparers of dissections and autopsies. Reinfection by tuberculosis via the skin, therefore, can result from accidental exposure to human tuberculous tissue in physicians, pathologists and laboratory workers; or to tissues of other infected animals, in veterinarians, butchers, etc. a431dd09f4 TVC is one of the many forms of cutaneous tuberculosis, such as the tuberculous chancre (which results from the cutaneous inoculation in immunocompetent people without previous exposure), and the reactivation cutaneous tuberculosis (the most common form, which appears in previously infected patients). Other forms of cutaneous tuberculosis are: lupus vulgaris, scrofuloderma, lichen scrofulosorum, erythema induratum and the papulonecrotic tuberculid.

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Heaf test Heaf. G. Heaf test, a diagnostic skin test, was long performed to determine whether or not children had been exposed to tuberculosis infection. Also known as the Sterne needle test, it was administered by a Heaf gun (trademarked "Sterne needle"), a spring-loaded instrument with six needles arranged in a circular formation which was inserted in the wrist or shoulder.
