== Health statistics == In 2020, 1.34% of births took place outside of a hospital in California, USA, where 1 out of 8 births in the country happen. Most of the out-of-hospital births are planned, and thus, not considered an emergency childbirth. However, about 12% of attempted home deliveries need urgent transport to a hospital. Some of the reasons for transferring to a hospital include failure of labor to progress, parental exhaustion, need for more pain medication, or parental/fetal... Vaginal birth is the most common mode of birth worldwide. Breastfeeding grip to compress the breast tissue. Between 2015 and 2020, only about 44% of infants worldwide were exclusively breastfed in the first six months of life. Infants may suckle directly from the breast, or milk may be extracted with a pump and then fed to the infant. The WHO recommends then continuing breastfeeding with appropriate complementary foods for up to 2 years, and beyond.
