In its simplest form, a fluoroscope consists of an X-ray source and a fluorescent screen, between which a patient is placed. However, since the 1950s most fluoroscopes have included X-ray image intensifiers and cameras as well, to improve the image's visibility and make it available on a remote display screen. For many decades, fluoroscopy tended to produce live pictures that were not recorded, but since the 1960s, as technology improved, recording and playback became the norm.

Rendering (computer graphics) Offline rendering can use a slower and higher-quality renderer. Today, to "render" commonly means to use a computer to generate an image from a precise specification, often created by an artist (or multiple artists) via interactive 3D modeling software. Interactive Rendering is the process of generating an image from input data such as 3D models. pre-rendering) in which images or film frames, are generated for later viewing. Types of images rendered include both still images and frames for films and video games. The word "rendering" (in one of its senses) originally meant the task performed by an artist when depicting a real or imaginary thing (the finished artwork is also called a "rendering")

Fluoroscopy Fluoroscopy has become an important tool in medical imaging to render moving pictures during a surgery or any Fluoroscopy (), informally referred to as "fluoro", is an imaging technique that uses X-rays to obtain real-time moving images of the interior of an object. computer and output as a visible-light image.
