Another title provided in the Canadian province of Ontario is registered practical nurse (RPN). In California and Texas, such a nurse is referred to as a licensed vocational nurse (LVN). The role that nurses have played in the development of Canada has been recognized through the designation of seven National Historic Sites of Canada related to nursing. Five nurses' residences (the Ann Baillie Building, Begbie Hall, the Hersey Pavilion, the Pavillon Mailloux and the St. Boniface Hospital Nurses' Residence) were designated in commemoration of the growing professionalism of nursing and of the expanded role of nurses in health care over the course of the 20th century. The La Corne Nursing Station and the Wilberforce Red Cross Outpost were designated, in part, in honour of the role played by nurses in delivering health care to isolated areas.

Becoming a pediatric nurse practitioner can take anywhere from 7-10 years, depending on the route taken. First, one must earn a Bachelor of Science in Nursing (BSN) by attending a four-year bachelor's degree program at an accredited college or university, majoring in nursing. After completing their BSN, they must take the National Council Licensure Examination (NCLEX) to obtain their registered nurse (RN) license. After completing and passing the NCLEX, they must gain experience in the nursing field, preferably in pediatrics. Recommended experience is anywhere from 1...
Hyperbaric nurses are responsible for administering hyperbaric oxygen therapy to patients and supervising them throughout the treatment. These nurses must work under a supervising physician trained in hyperbaric medicine who is available during the treatment in case of emergency. Hyperbaric nurses either join the patient inside the multiplace hyperbaric oxygen therapy chamber or operate the equipment from outside of the monoplace hyperbaric oxygen therapy chamber, monitoring for adverse reactions to the treatment. Patients can experience adverse reactions to the hyperbaric oxygen therapy such as oxygen toxicity, hypoglycemia, anxiety, barotrauma, or pneumothorax. The nurse must know how to handle each adverse event appropriately. The most common adverse effect is middle ear barotrauma, injury to the middle ear due to pressure...

In the United States, while nearly 1 in 10 residents
