

What Is Memory Foam

Foam Foam is a two-phase material system and a type of dispersed media, consisting of gas cells dispersed in a continuous liquid or solid phase to form a cellular structure. In most foams, the gas occupies most of the volume and is divided into bubbles separated by thin films of liquid or solid material

Mattresses are usually placed on top of a bed base which may be solid, as in the case of a platform bed, or elastic, such as an upholstered wood and wire box spring or a slatted foundation. Popular in Europe, a divan incorporates both mattress and foundation in a single upholstered, footed unit. Divans have at least one innerspring layer as well as cushioning materials. They may be supplied with a secondary mattress or a removable "topper". Mattresses may also be filled with air or water, or a variety of natural fibers, such as in futons. Kapok is a common mattress material in Southeast Asia, and coir in South Asia.

Memory foam Memory foam consists mainly of polyurethane with additional chemicals that increase its viscosity and density. The foam bubbles or 'cells' are open, effectively creating a matrix through which air can move. Newer foams may recover their original shape more quickly. Higher-density memory foam softens in reaction to body heat, allowing it to mold to a warm body in a few minutes

Polyurethane formulations cover an extremely wide range of stiffness, hardness, and densities. These materials include: Low density elastomers used in footwear Foams are formed by dispersing gas into a liquid or solid, typically in the presence of surfactants or other stabilising agents, and their stability depends on factors such as surface tension, the Marangoni effect, drainage, and gas diffusion. Foams are classified as liquid or solid foams, which differ in their formation, structure and physical behaviour. Solid foams may be further divided into open-cell and closed-cell structures that differ in their mechanical and transport properties. The network effect is the force working to restore the foam's structure when it is deformed. This effect is generated by the deformed porous material pushing outwards to restore its structure against an applied pressure.
