By 2025, almost all species had been given binomial names. == Definition and associated terms == The ACB was established in 1917 as the Commonwealth Film Censorship Board. In 1988 it was incorporated for administrative purposes into the Office of Film and Literature Classification (OFLC), until its dissolution in 2006. Following the legislative changes enacted in the Commonwealth Classification Act 1995, it became known as the Classification Board. The B2 classification was first created by the IBSA in the 1970s, and has largely remained unchanged since despite an effort by the International Paralympic Committee (IPC) to move towards a more functional and evidence-based classification system. Classification is often handled on the international level by IBSA although it is also handled by national sport federations. The system was first described in the Burgon Society's annual in 2001 and adopted as standard by robe makers and scholars of academic dress

Cavalier-Smith's system of classification published extensively on the classification of protists. As with classifications of others, such as Carl Linnaeus, Ernst Haeckel, Robert Whittaker, and Carl Woese, Cavalier-Smith's classification attempts to incorporate the latest developments in taxonomy. His classifications has been a major influence in the modern taxonomy, particularly of protists. His classifications complemented his ideas communicated in scientific publications, talks, and diagrams. This initial system continued to be modified in subsequent versions that were published until he died in 2021. Cavalier-Smith used his classifications to convey his opinions about the evolutionary relationships among various organisms, principally microbial. Different iterations might have a wider or narrow scope, include different groupings, provide greater or lesser detail, and place groups in different arrangements as his thinking changed. One of his major contributions to biology was his proposal of a new kingdom of life: the Chromista.
