== Signs and symptoms == 90f7298fa4 Gabapentin binds to $\alpha 2\delta$ subunits to modulate calcium channel function and neurotransmitter release, weakly affects glutamate signaling pathways, and does not act on GABA receptors. Sleepiness and dizziness are the most common side effects. Serious side effects include extreme sedation, respiratory depression and allergic reactions. In December 2008, the US Food and Drug Administration issued a class-wide warning for gabapentinoids for an increased risk of suicide. Approximately two years after this pronouncement, a pharmacoepidemiologic study was conducted that showed there was no outstanding difference in suicide attempt rates between... 90f7298fa4 == Uses == 90f7298fa4

Alcohol withdrawal syndrome More severe symptoms may include seizures, and delirium tremens (DTs); which can be fatal in untreated patients. Symptoms typically include anxiety, shakiness, sweating, vomiting, fast heart rate, and a mild fever. Symptoms start at around 6 hours after the last drink. alcohol withdrawal syndrome. Limited evidence supports the use of gabapentin or carbamazepine for the treatment of mild or moderate alcohol withdrawal as the Alcohol withdrawal syndrome (AWS) is a set of symptoms that can occur following a reduction in or cessation of alcohol use after a period of excessive use. Peak incidence of seizures occurs at 24 to 36 hours and peak incidence of DT is at 48 to 72 hours 90f7298fa4

The typical treatment of alcohol withdrawal is with benzodiazepines such as chlordiazepoxide or diazepam. Often, the amounts given are based on a person's symptoms. Thiamine is recommended routinely. Electrolyte problems and low blood sugar should also be treated. Early treatment improves outcomes. 90f7298fa4

Benzodiazepine Long-term use is controversial because of concerns about decreasing effectiveness, physical dependence, benzodiazepine withdrawal. withdrawal effects 90f7298fa4

Barbiturates have largely been replaced by benzodiazepines and nonbenzodiazepines ("Z-drugs") in routine medical practice, particularly in the treatment of anxiety disorders and insomnia, because of the significantly lower risk of overdose, and the lack of an antidote for barbiturate overdose. Despite this, barbiturates are still in use for various purposes: in general anesthesia, epilepsy, treatment of acute migraines or cluster headaches, acute tension headaches, euthanasia, capital punishment, and assisted suicide. 90f7298fa4

Opioid withdrawal All opioids, both recreational drugs and medications, when reduced or stopped, can lead to opioid withdrawal symptoms. Opioid withdrawal can be managed by the use of opioid replacement therapy, while symptoms may be relieved by the use of medications such as lofexidine and clonidine. Signs and symptoms of withdrawal can include drug craving, anxiety, restless legs syndrome, nausea, vomiting, diarrhea, sweating, and an elevated heart rate. When withdrawal symptoms are due to recreational opioid use, the term opioid use disorder is used, whereas when due to prescribed medications, the term prescription opioid use disorder is used. physiological effects. When withdrawal symptoms Opioid withdrawal is a set of symptoms arising from the sudden cessation or reduction of opioids where previous usage has been heavy and prolonged. All opioids, both recreational drugs and medications, when reduced or stopped, can lead to opioid withdrawal symptoms. Opioid use triggers a rapid adaptation in cellular signaling pathways that, when reduced or stopped, can cause adverse physiological effects 90f7298fa4

The terms may sometimes be used interchangeably or may be used in somewhat different contexts. Nearly all commonly used depressants are addictive, and use of them carries the risk of death from respiratory depression, especially in opioids. 90f7298fa4

Barbiturate barbiturate withdrawal produces potentially fatal effects such as seizures, in a manner reminiscent of delirium tremens and benzodiazepine withdrawal although Barbiturates are a class of depressant drugs that are chemically derived from barbituric acid. They have been used recreationally for their anti-anxiety and sedative effects, and are thus controlled in most countries due to the risks associated with such use. They are effective when used medically as anxiolytics, hypnotics, and anticonvulsants, but have physical and psychological addiction potential as well as overdose potential among other possible adverse effects 90f7298fa4

central nervous system (CNS) depressant and derivative of the inhibitory neurotransmitter, GABA. It is used for the treatment of neuropathic pain caused by diabetic neuropathy, postherpetic neuralgia, and central pain. It is moderately effective: about 30–40% of those given gabapentin for diabetic neuropathy or postherpetic neuralgia have a meaningful benefit. 90f7298fa4 In the Western world... 90f7298fa4 Withdrawal from any opioid produces similar signs and symptoms. However, the severity and duration of withdrawal depend on the type and dose of opioid taken and the duration and frequency of use. 90f7298fa4 Alcohol withdrawal may occur in those who are alcohol dependent. This may occur following a planned or unplanned decrease in alcohol intake. The underlying mechanism involves a decreased responsiveness of GABA receptors in the brain. The withdrawal process is typically

followed using the Clinical Institute Withdrawal Assessment for Alcohol scale (CIWA-Ar). 90f7298fa4

Clinically used gabapentinoids include gabapentin, pregabalin, baclofen and mirogabalin, as well as a gabapentin prodrug, gabapentin enacarbil. Further analogues like imagabalin and atagabalin have been tested in clinical trials but their development has been halted. Other gabapentinoids which are used in scientific research but have not been approved for medical use include 4-methylpregabalin and PD-217,014. 90f7298fa4

Phenibut Side effects of phenibut can include sedation, sleepiness, nausea, irritability, agitation. usually taken orally (swallowed by mouth), but may be given intravenously 90f7298fa4

Pregabalin competitively antagonize the effects of gabapentinoids. In accordance, while gabapentinoids like pregabalin and gabapentin have nanomolar affinities for 90f7298fa4
