Antidepressant discontinuation syndrome serotonin reuptake inhibitors (SSRIs), serotonin-norepinephrine reuptake inhibitors (SNRIs), monoamine oxidase inhibitors (MAOIs), and tricyclic antidepressants Antidepressant discontinuation syndrome, or antidepressant withdrawal, is a condition that can occur following switching, reducing, or discontinuing an antidepressant medication following its continuous use of at least a month. This is referred to as protracted withdrawal and may last for several months or years. If stopped too quickly, a withdrawal injury can occur. Psychosis may rarely occur. The symptoms may include dizziness, vertigo, postural orthostatic tachycardia syndrome (POTS), tinnitus, insomnia, nausea, poor balance, sensory changes, "brain zaps", emotional lability or extreme emotional changes, rage, suicidal ideation, akathisia, dysesthesia, intrusive thoughts, depersonalization, and derealization, mania, anxiety, depression, stuttering, and flu-like symptoms. Depending on the specific antidepressant's half-life, withdrawal can begin within a few days or weeks, but late onset or delayed onset withdrawal can occur months after cessation 82b0221ceb

SSRIs primarily inhibit serotonin transporter (SERT) in the brain and have negligible effects on dopamine transporter (DAT) and norepinephrine transporter (NET). Inhibiting the binding of the neurotransmitter serotonin (5-HT) to SERT results in increased 5-HT concentration in the synaptic cleft leading to increased binding of 5-HT to postsynaptic receptors. This was once thought to be the mechanism that resulted in improvement of depression symptoms, however

In children and adolescents, evidence of efficacy is more limited, despite a marked increase in antidepressant prescriptions for these age groups since the 2000s. Marketed SSRIs include six main antidepressants—citalopram, escitalopram, fluoxetine, fluvoxamine, paroxetine, and sertraline—and dapoxetine, which is indicated for premature ejaculation. Studies have shown that venlafaxine improves post-traumatic stress disorder (PTSD) as a recommended first-line treatment. It may also be used for chronic neuropathic pain. Discontinuation syndrome, which resembles recurrent depression in the case of the SSRI class, may occur after stopping the intake of any antidepressant, having effects which may be permanent and irreversible. Tapering off medications gradually is shown to reduce the risk of withdrawal complications. 82b0221ceb According to the FDA, the heightened risk of suicidality occurs within the first one to two months of treatment. Compared with placebo, the use of antidepressants is associated with an increase in suicidal behavior or thoughts among those 25 years old or younger (OR=1.62). A review of RCTs and epidemiological studies by Healy and Whitaker found an increase in suicidal acts by a factor of 2.4. There is no effect or possibly a mild protective effect among those aged 25 to 64 (OR=0.79). 82b0221ceb
