Hallmarks of ICP include the following symptoms: 2c768760bf Severe complications of pregnancy, childbirth, and the puerperium are present in 1.6% of mothers in the US, and in 1.5% of mothers in Canada. In the immediate postpartum period (puerperium), 87% to 94% of women report at least one health problem. Long-term health problems (persisting after six months postpartum) are reported by 31% of women. 2c768760bf Itching is a common symptom of pregnancy, affecting around 23% of women. The majority of times, itching is a minor annoyance caused by changes to the skin, especially that of the abdomen. However, there are instances when itching may be a symptom of ICP. Although typically noticed on the palms of the hands and the soles of the feet, the itching can occur anywhere on the body. 2c768760bf

Nausea It can be a debilitating symptom if prolonged and has been described as placing discomfort on the chest, abdomen, or back of the throat. Nausea or "morning sickness" is common during early pregnancy but may

Pregnancy symptoms may be categorized based on trimester as well as region of the body affected. Depending on severity, common symptoms in pregnancy can develop into complications. Each pregnancy can be quite different and many people do not experience the same or all of the symptoms. Common symptoms are headache, fatigue, lethargy, tachycardia, tachypnea,

Medications taken to prevent and treat nausea and vomiting are called antiemetics. The most commonly prescribed antiemetics in the US are promethazine, metoclopramide, and the newer ondansetron. The word nausea is from Latin nausea, from Greek ναυσία - nausia, "ναυτία" - nautia, seasickness, "feeling sick or queasy", from Latin naus, Greek ναος, a ship. 2c768760bf

Pregnancy-associated malaria Placental malaria interferes with the transmission of vital substances through the fetal

placenta, which can result in stillbirths, miscarriages, and dangerously low birth weights. Quinine is used as an alternative if chloroquine-resistance is detected. During the second and third trimester, the WHO Pregnancy-associated malaria (PAM) or placental malaria is a presentation of malaria in pregnancy which is life-threatening to both pregnant women and unborn fetuses. PAM occurs when a pregnant woman contracts malaria, generally as a result of *Plasmodium falciparum* infection, and because she is pregnant, is at greater risk of associated complications such as placental malaria. Complications may include inflammation of the esophagus,

cough, or asthma. There may also be associated regurgitation. In those who are affected, it usually starts near the end of the first trimester or in the second trimester, becomes more frequent by the time of the third trimester, and resolves on its own soon after delivery

Over 30 definitions of nausea were proposed in a 2011 book on the topic. Pregnant women experience numerous adjustments in their endocrine system that help support the developing fetus. The fetal-placental unit secretes steroid hormones and proteins that alter the function of various maternal endocrine glands. Sometimes, the changes in certain hormone levels and their effects on their target organs can lead to gestational diabetes and gestational hypertension. Most women with this condition present in the third trimester (although it can present as early as seven weeks) with itching without a rash. The underlying mechanism involves the size of the baby as well as hormone changes. This results in stomach acid entering the esophagus. Diagnosis is generally based on symptoms; though it may rarely be supported by upper endoscopy. Esophagitis, on the other hand, is uncommon and usually occurs in those who had the disease before the pregnancy. The diagnosis of gastroesophageal reflux disease (GERD) can be considered if heartburn is troublesome or has complications. If a person had the disease before the pregnancy, heartburn can be considered an exacerbation of GERD. Conception usually occurs following vaginal intercourse, but can also occur through assisted reproductive technology procedures. A pregnancy may end in a

live birth, a miscarriage, an induced abortion, or a stillbirth. Childbirth typically occurs around 40 weeks from the start of the last menstrual period (LMP), a span known as the gestational age; this is just over nine months. Counting by fertilization age, the length is about 38 weeks. Implantation occurs on average 8–9 days after fertilization. An embryo is the term for the developing offspring during the first seven weeks following implantation (i.e. ten weeks' gestational age), after which the term fetus is used until the birth of a baby.

2c768760bf Onset is mostly in the third trimester, but may begin earlier.

2c768760bf Nausea is a non-specific symptom, which means that it has many possible causes. Some common causes of nausea are gastroenteritis and other gastrointestinal disorders, food poisoning, motion sickness, dizziness, migraine, fainting, low blood sugar, anxiety, hyperthermia, dehydration and lack of sleep. Nausea is a side effect of many medications including

chemotherapy, or morning sickness in early pregnancy. Nausea may also be caused by disgust and depression.

Anemia in pregnancy While anemia in pregnancy may be pathologic, in normal pregnancies, the increase in RBC mass is smaller than the increase in plasma volume, leading to a mild decrease in hemoglobin concentration referred to as physiologic (or dilutional) anemia.

Anemia is an extremely common condition in pregnancy world-wide, conferring a number of health risks to mother and child. varies in each trimester of pregnancy. Anemia in pregnancy is a decrease in the total red blood cells (RBCs) or hemoglobin in the blood during pregnancy. Maternal signs and symptoms are usually non-specific, but can include: fatigue, pallor, dyspnea, palpitations, and dizziness. First trimester hemoglobin < 11 g/dL - Second trimester hemoglobin < 10. There are numerous well-known maternal consequences of anemia including: maternal cardiovascular strain, reduced physical and mental performance, reduced peripartum blood reserves, increased risk for peripartum blood product transfusion, and increased risk for maternal mortality. 5 g/dL - Third trimester hemoglobin < 11 - Anemia is a condition in which blood has a lower-than-normal amount of red blood cells or hemoglobin
