Affirmatively Furthering Fair Housing The law requires that "All executive departments and agencies shall administer their programs and activities relating to housing and urban development (including any Federal agency having regulatory or supervisory authority over financial institutions) in a manner affirmatively to further the purposes of" the Fair Housing Act. The law also requires the Secretary of the United States Department of Housing and Urban Development (HUD) to administer all HUD programs in a manner that affirmatively furthers fair housing. Stanley Plan The plan also included measures designed to curb the Virginia state chapter of the National Association for the Advancement of Colored People (NAACP), which many Virginia segregationists believed was responsible for "stirring up" litigation to integrate the public schools. The Stanley plan was a critical element in the policy of "massive resistance" to the Brown ruling advocated by U. S. S. Byrd Sr. Supreme Court in Brown v. Stanley, a Democrat, who proposed the program and successfully pushed for its enactment. The legislative program was named for Governor Thomas B. state of Virginia. S. The statutes were designed to ensure racial segregation would continue in that state's public schools despite the unanimous ruling of the U. He then served in the United States Marine Corps from 1922 to 1925, attaining the rank of sergeant. After his military discharge, he worked as a reporter for The Wall Street Journal while he studied at the Detroit College of Law, graduating in 1933.
