This can lead outgroups to misunderstand communication attempts. The use of jargon became more popular Jargon, or technical language, is the specialized terminology associated with a particular field or area of activity. Jargon is sometimes understood as a form of technical slang and then distinguished from the official terminology used in a particular field of activity. Some sources, however, treat these terms as synonymous. The key characteristic that distinguishes jargon from the rest of a language is its specialized vocabulary, which includes terms and definitions of words that are unique to the context, and terms used in a narrower and more exact sense than when used in colloquial language.
