

5 Foot 4 In Meters

Discovered in December 1986, the "foot" is located in a maintenance corridor below the remains of Reactor No. 4, though the often-photographed formation is only a small portion of several larger corium masses in the area. It has a popular reputation as being one of the most, if not the most radioactive object in history, though this is false. There are several more radioactive masses of corium at Chernobyl, and a spent nuclear fuel rod can emit as much as 10 times the radiation of the Elephant's Foot. Decay of its radioactive components has also significantly reduced the radiation.

The United States is the only industrialized country that uses the (international) foot in preference to the meter in many but not all commercial, engineering, and standards activities. Historically, the "foot" was a part of many local systems of units, including the Greek, Roman, Chinese, French, and English systems. It varied in length from country to country, from city to city, and sometimes from trade to trade. Its length was usually between 250 mm (9.8 in) and 335 mm (13.2 in) and was generally, but not always, subdivided into twelve inches or 16 digits.
