Group decision-making Group decision-making (also known as collaborative decision-making or collective decision-making) is a situation faced when individuals collectively make a choice from the alternatives before them. This can. Under normal everyday conditions, collaborative or group decision-making would often be preferred and would generate more benefits than individual decision-making when there is the time for proper deliberation, discussion, and dialogue. The decision is then no longer attributable to any single individual who is a member of the group. In this vein, certain collaborative arrangements have the potential to generate better net performance outcomes than individuals acting on their own. This is because all the individuals and social group processes such as social influence contribute to the outcome. In workplace settings, collaborative decision-making is one of the most successful models to generate buy-in from other stakeholders, build consensus, and encourage creativity. According to the idea of synergy, decisions made collectively also tend to be more effective than decisions made by a single individual. Normative model of decision-making Drawing upon literature from the areas of leadership, group decision-making, and procedural fairness, Vroom's model predicts the effectiveness of decision-making procedures. Specifically, Vroom's model takes into account the situation and the importance of the decision to determine which of Vroom's five decision-making methods will be most effective.
