A hierarchy can link entities either directly or indirectly, and either vertically or diagonally.

The only direct links in a hierarchy are to one's immediate superior or subordinate.

Hierarchical links can extend "vertically" upwards or downwards via multiple links in the same direction, following a path. All parts of the hierarchy that are not linked vertically to one another can also be "horizontally" linked through a path by traveling up the hierarchy to find a common direct or indirect superior, and then down again.
