Both are controversial in autism communities and advocacy which has led to significant infighting between these two camps. The pathology paradigm advocates for supporting research into therapies, treatments, or a cure to help minimize or remove autistic traits, seeing treatment as vital to help individuals with autism, while the neurodiversity movement believes autism should be seen as a different way of being and advocates against a cure and interventions that focus on normalization (but do not oppose interventions that emphasize acceptance, adaptive skills building, or interventions that aim to reduce intrinsically harmful traits, behaviors, or conditions), seeing it as trying to exterminate autistic people and their individuality

Members of the autistic rights and neurodiversity movements do not see autism as a disease that needs to be cured, and have criticized Autism Speaks for seeking a cure. The word "cure" was dropped from its mission statement in 2016. Autism Speaks has also been criticized by some activists, advocates, and researchers for perpetuating stigma against autistic people, promoting pseudoscience, excluding autistic people from decision-making, and continuing to fund genetic research (which some

Autism Features of autism are present from early childhood and the condition typically persists throughout life. Because autism is a spectrum disorder, presentations vary and support needs range from minimal assistance to full-time, 24-hour care. Autism, also known as autism spectrum disorder (ASD), is a condition characterized by impairment in social communication and interaction, as well as a need or strong preference for predictability and routine, sensory processing differences, focused interests, or repetitive behaviors. Management of autism Treatment is typically catered to the person's needs. Despite the scientific consensus for the absence of a relationship, and the Wakefield paper's retraction, the anti-vaccination movement at large continues to promote theories linking the two.

c790ba5c87 Classic autism was last recognized as a diagnosis in the DSM-IV and ICD-10, and has been superseded by autism-spectrum disorder in the DSM-5 (2013) and ICD-11 (2022). Globally, classic autism was estimated to affect 24.8 million people as of 2015. c790ba5c87 Autism is likely caused by a combination of genetic and environmental factors, with genetic factors thought to heavily predominate. Certain proposed environmental causes of autism have been met with controversy, such as the fraudulent vaccine hypothesis that, although disproved, has negatively impacted vaccination rates among children. c790ba5c87
