In the following, bridges are classified either according to their material or their function. Most data not otherwise marked come from O'Connor's Roman Bridges, which lists 330 stone bridges for traffic, 34 timber bridges and 54 aqueduct bridges. An even larger compilation of more than 900 Roman bridges (as of 2011) is offered by the Italian scholar Galliazzo, who is used here only selectively. bdf835b752 The construction and operating company was the Sociedad del Ferrocarril Hullero de La Robla a Valmaseda, which from 1905 onwards was renamed Ferrocarriles de La Robla. In 1972 the company went into bankruptcy and the public undertaking FEVE took over the line. Under its management, the situation not only failed to improve but worsened dramatically. In 1991, passenger services were suspended — restricted to freight only — but, through various agreements with the public administration, different services between León and Bilbao were resumed in 2003.
