Dorsal carpometacarpal ligaments dorsal carpometacarpal ligaments, the strongest and most distinct carpometacarpal ligaments, connect the carpal and metacarpal bones on their dorsal surfaces 7e325e01a6

Plantar calcaneocuboid ligament, deep to previous 7e325e01a6

Lisfranc ligament Lisfranc ligament is one of several ligaments which connects the medial cuneiform bone to the second metatarsal. Sometimes, the term Lisfranc ligament refers 7e325e01a6

== Structure == 7e325e01a6 The plantar calcaneonavicular ligamentous complex is a broad and thick band with three constituent ligaments. These connect the anterior margin of the sustentaculum tali of the calcaneus to the plantar surface of the navicular bone. Its individual components are the: 7e325e01a6

Palmar carpometacarpal ligaments carpometacarpal ligaments (or volar) are a series of bands on the palmar surface of the carpometacarpal joints that connect the carpal bones to the second 7e325e01a6

== Comparative anatomy == 7e325e01a6 Ligaments are similar to tendons and fasciae as they are all made of connective tissue. The differences among them are in the connections that they make: ligaments connect one bone to another bone, tendons connect muscle to bone, and fasciae connect muscles to other muscles. These are all found in the skeletal system of the human body. Ligaments cannot usually be regenerated naturally; however, there are periodontal ligament stem cells located near the periodontal ligament which are involved in the adult regeneration of periodontist ligament. 7e325e01a6 Plantar plates, fibrocartilaginous structures in the metatarsophalangeal and interphalangeal joints of the toes. 7e325e01a6 Plantar cuneocuboid ligament, that connects the cuboid with the cuneiform bones 7e325e01a6

Plantar cuneonavicular ligaments, that connect the navicular bone with adjacent cuneiform bones 7e325e01a6

Plantar metatarsal ligaments adjacent metatarsal bones, similar to the dorsal metatarsal ligaments, helping strengthen the metatarsal joints and prevent bone spreading while pushing 7e325e01a6

Dense connective tissue Tendons attach skeletal muscles to bones; ligaments connect bones to bones at joints. structures such as tendons and ligaments. Ligaments are more stretchy and 7e325e01a6
