Neonatal infections may Neonatal infections are infections of the neonate (newborn) acquired during prenatal development or within the first four weeks of life. Neonatal infections may present soon after delivery, or take several weeks to show symptoms. Some neonatal infections such as HIV, hepatitis B, and malaria do not become apparent until much later. destructive and expanding growth consisting of keratinizing, squamous epithelium in the middle ear and/or mastoid process. They often become infected and can result in chronically draining ears. This can result in the destruction of the bones of the middle ear (ossicles), as well as growth through the base of the skull into the brain b9711d538c

Barotrauma This form of barotrauma is usually easily avoided. Complications may include local infection. Middle ear barotrauma (MEBT) is an injury caused by a difference in pressure between the middle ear and the atmosphere.

Ear The ear canal is cleaned via earwax, which naturally migrates to the auricle. The middle ear includes the tympanic cavity and the three ossicles. The outer ear consists of the auricle, the visible outer part, and the ear canal. The "pinna" was actually an ear-shaped cartilage structure grown by In vertebrates, an ear is the organ that enables hearing and (in mammals) body balance using the vestibular system. In humans, the ear is described as having three parts: the outer ear, the middle ear and the inner ear. The inner ear sits in the bony labyrinth, and contains structures which are key to several senses: the semicircular canals, which enable balance and eye tracking when moving; the utricle and saccule, which enable balance when stationary; and the cochlea, which enables hearing. mouse was a laboratory mouse that had what looked like a human ear grown on its back

The first recorded mention of the use of earplugs is in the Greek tale *Odyssey*, wherein Odysseus's crew is warned about the Sirens that sing from an island they will sail past. Circe, their hostess, tells them of the Sirens' bewitching song that makes men drive their boats ashore and perish. She advised Odysseus to fashion earplugs for his men from beeswax so they would not be lured to their deaths by the sirens' song.

== Signs and symptoms ==

Risk factors include previous maternal infection, preterm delivery (< 37 weeks gestation) and premature rupture of membranes (breakage of the amniotic sac) which substantially increases the risk of neonatal sepsis by allowing passage for bacteria to enter the womb prior to the birth of the infant. Preterm or low birth weight neonates are more vulnerable to neonatal infection. While preterm neonates are at a particularly high risk, all neonates can develop

infection. Maternal screening for intrapartum infections reduce the risk of neonatal infection. Pregnant women... b9711d538c Other more common conditions (e.g. otitis externa) may also present with these symptoms, but cholesteatoma is much more serious and should not be overlooked. If a patient presents to a doctor with ear discharge and hearing loss, the doctor should consider cholesteatoma until the disease is definitely excluded. Other less common symptoms (all less than 15%) of cholesteatoma may include pain, balance disruption, tinnitus, earache, headaches and bleeding from the ear. There can also be facial nerve weakness. Balance symptoms in the presence of a cholesteatoma raise the possibility that the cholesteatoma is eroding... b9711d538c
