Cellular differentiation Differentiation happens multiple times during the development of a multicellular organism as it changes from a simple zygote to a complex system of tissues and cell types. With a few exceptions, cellular differentiation almost never involves a change in the DNA sequence itself. Cellular differentiation, also known as cellular specification, is the process in which a stem cell changes from one type to a differentiated one. Thus, different cells can have very different physical. These changes are largely due to highly controlled modifications in gene expression and are the study of epigenetics. Differentiation dramatically changes a cell's size, shape, membrane potential, metabolic activity, and responsiveness to signals. Usually Cellular differentiation, also known as cellular specification, is the process in which a stem cell changes from one type to a differentiated one. Usually, the cell changes to a more specialized type. Some differentiation occurs in response to antigen exposure. Metabolic composition, however, gets dramatically altered where stem cells are characterized by abundant metabolites with highly unsaturated structures whose levels decrease upon differentiation. Differentiation continues in adulthood as adult stem cells divide and create fully differentiated daughter cells during tissue repair and during normal cell turnover d79f11fca0

This cycle of information organisation involves a variety of stakeholders, including those who are responsible for assuring the quality, accessibility and utility of acquired information; those who are responsible for its safe storage and disposal; and those who need it for decision making.
