Biological monitoring measures the body burden of a pollutant but Exposure assessment is a branch of environmental science, toxicology, epidemiology, environmental engineering, and occupational hygiene that focuses on the processes that take place at the interface between the environment containing the contaminant of interest and the organism being considered. The assessment includes measurements of the amount of a contaminant absorbed by an exposed target organism, in what form, at what rate, and how much of the absorbed amount is actually available to produce a biological effect. measures the amount of a pollutant within body tissues or fluids (such as blood or urine).
