In the resulting rearrangement to create monophyletic genera, four species: the sarus crane (*Antigone antigone*), the brolga (*Antigone rubicunda*), the sandhill crane (*Antigone canadensis*) and the white-naped crane (*Antigone vipio*), were placed in the resurrected genus *Antigone* that had originally been erected by German naturalist Ludwig Reichenbach in 1853. 6fbd415e0a Hens and other egg-laying creatures are raised throughout the world, and mass production of chicken eggs is a global industry. In 2009, an estimated 62.1 million metric tons of eggs were produced worldwide from a total laying flock of approximately 6.4 billion hens. It is found on the Atlantic Coast from New Jersey to the mouth of the Amazon River, and along the Pacific Coast from British Columbia to Peru, including the Galapagos Islands. Some texts may still refer to this species as *Eurostopodus mystacalis albogularis*. Before 2002, this species was regarded as conspecific with New Caledonian nightjar *Eurostopodus exul* and Solomons nightjar *Eurostopodus nigripennis*. However, later research separated the three into their own species based on differences in calls and song, and morphology.
