The most common infectious causes in adults are viral, whereas in children bacterial causes predominate. The viral infection may occur along with other symptoms of a common cold. Both viral and bacterial cases are easily spread among people. Allergies to pollen or animal hair are also a common cause. Diagnosis is often based on signs and symptoms. These viruses may be spread through the air when people cough or by direct contact. Risk factors include exposure to tobacco smoke, dust, and other air pollution. A small number of cases are due to high levels of air pollution or bacteria such as *Mycoplasma pneumoniae* or *Bordetella pertussis*. Diagnosis is typically based on a person's signs and symptom. The color of the sputum does not indicate if the infection is viral or bacterial. Determining the underlying organism is typically not needed. Other causes of similar symptoms include asthma, pneumonia, bronchiolitis, bronchiectasis, and COPD. A chest X-ray may be useful to detect pneumonia. 0f31984f4e ==

Infectious mononucleosis disease is often pharyngitis, which is frequently accompanied by enlarged tonsils with pus—an exudate similar to that seen in cases of strep throat. Most people recover in two to four weeks; however, fatigue may last months. Most people are infected by the virus as children, when the disease produces few or no symptoms. In Infectious mononucleosis (IM, mono), also known as glandular fever, is an infection usually caused by the Epstein-Barr virus (EBV). In young adults, the disease often results in fever, sore throat, enlarged lymph nodes in the neck, and fatigue. The liver or spleen may also become swollen, and in less than one percent of cases splenic rupture may occur 0f31984f4e

Infection of GAS may spread through direct contact with mucus or sores on the skin. GAS infections can cause over 500,000 deaths per year. Conjunctivitis conjunctivitis are Staphylococcus including Staph aureus, Streptococcus such as strep pneumoniae, Haemophilus species and Moraxella catarrhalis. The affected eye may have increased tears or be stuck shut in the morning. Pain, burning, scratchiness, or itchiness may occur. Swelling of the sclera may also occur. Less commonly Conjunctivitis, also known as pink eye, is inflammation of the conjunctiva, the thin and clear layer that covers the white surface of the eye and the inner eyelid. Itching is more common in cases that are due to allergies. It makes the eye appear pink or reddish. Conjunctivitis can affect one or both eyes 0f31984f4e

Streptococcal pharyngitis Some develop a sandpaper-like rash which is known as scarlet fever. A headache and nausea or vomiting may also occur. Common symptoms include fever, sore throat, red tonsils, and enlarged lymph nodes in the front of the neck. Symptoms typically begin one to three days after exposure and last seven to ten days. Because of strict quarantine procedures to reduce the risk of exotic pests and diseases entering Australia, this was the first outbreak of equine influenza in Australia. Horses in Australia had not been exposed to the virus and, not being vaccinated, were fully susceptible. 0f31984f4e Prevention is by frequent hand washing, and not sharing eating utensils. There is no vaccine for the disease. Treatment with antibiotics is only recommended in those with a confirmed... 0f31984f4e

Group A streptococcal infection S. fascia and muscle strep throat AKA strep pharyngitis – pharynx Less common: bacteremia – can be associated with these infections, but is not typical. If the bacteria enters the bloodstream, the infection can become severe and life-threatening, and is called an invasive GAS (iGAS). septic Group A streptococcal infections are a number of infections with Streptococcus pyogenes, a group A streptococcus (GAS). pyogenes is a species of beta-hemolytic Gram-positive bacteria that is responsible for a wide range of infections that are mostly common and fairly mild 0f31984f4e

Acute bronchitis The infection may last from a few to ten days. Acute bronchitis can be caused by contagious pathogens, most commonly viruses. The most common symptom is a cough. Some have symptoms for up to six weeks. Typical viruses include respiratory Acute bronchitis, also known as a chest cold, is short-term bronchitis – inflammation of the bronchi (large and medium-sized airways) of the lungs. especially high or persistent fevers. The cough may persist for several weeks afterward with the total duration of symptoms usually around three weeks. Other symptoms include coughing up mucus, wheezing, shortness of breath, fever, and chest discomfort 0f31984f4e

Antivirals for viral infections. 0f31984f4e Prevention is partly by handwashing. Treatment depends on the underlying cause. In the majority of viral cases, there is no specific treatment. Infection pyogenes, that is retrieved An infection is the invasion of tissues by pathogens, their multiplication, and the reaction of host tissues to the infectious agent and the toxins they produce. These may vary from very mild conditions to severe, life-threatening diseases. Although... 0f31984f4e While usually caused by the Epstein-Barr virus, also known as human herpesvirus 4, which is a member of the herpesvirus family, a few other viruses and the protozoon *Toxoplasma gondii* may also cause the disease. It is primarily spread through saliva but can rarely be spread through semen or blood. Spread may occur by objects such as drinking glasses or toothbrushes, or through a cough or sneeze. Those who are infected can spread the disease weeks before symptoms develop. Mono is primarily diagnosed based on the symptoms and can be confirmed with blood tests for specific antibodies. Another typical finding is increased blood lymphocytes of which more than 10% are reactive... 0f31984f4e A combination of control measures was successful in combating the outbreak. The last new infected property was identified on 22 December 2007. The zones which had been instituted to permit and restrict movements according to risk were progressively lifted from areas of New South Wales and Queensland. 1889–1890 pandemic The most reported effects of the pandemic took place from October 1889 to December 1890, with recurrences in March to June 1891, November 1891 to June 1892, the northern winter of 1893–1894, and early 1895. The pandemic killed about 1 million people out of a world population of about 1. Infections can be caused by a wide range of pathogens, most prominently bacteria and viruses. Hosts can fight infections using their immune systems. Mammalian hosts react to infections with an innate response, often involving inflammation, followed by an adaptive response. 0f31984f4e The symptoms of COVID-19 can vary but often include fever, fatigue, cough, shortness of breath, loss of smell, and loss of taste. Symptoms may begin one to fourteen days after exposure to the virus. At least a third of people who are infected do not develop noticeable symptoms. Of those who develop symptoms noticeable enough to be classified as patients, most (81%) develop mild to moderate symptoms (up to mild pneumonia), while 14% develop severe symptoms (dyspnea, hypoxia, or more than 50% lung involvement on imaging), and 5% develop critical symptoms (respiratory failure, shock, or multiorgan dysfunction). Older people have a higher risk of developing severe symptoms and dying. Some people experience persistent symptoms (long COVID), for months or years after infection, including fatigue, cognitive issues and shortness of breath. Several virulence factors contribute to the pathogenesis of GAS, such as M protein, hemolysins, and extracellular enzymes. 0f31984f4e According to researchers' estimates, excess mortality from Russian influenza in the Russian Empire for the period 1889–1890 could be from 60,000 to 90,000 people, with lethality from the virus, a little more than 0.2%. 0f31984f4e Infectious diseases remain a significant global health concern; communicable, maternal, neonatal, and nutritional diseases together accounted for an estimated 18.6% of global deaths in 2017. The branch of medicine that focuses on infections is referred to as infectious diseases. 0f31984f4e Treatment for infections depends on the type of pathogen involved. Common medications include: 0f31984f4e COVID-19 symptoms range from asymptomatic to deadly, but most commonly include fever, sore throat, nocturnal cough, and fatigue. Transmission of the virus is often through airborne particles. Mutations have produced many strains (variants) with varying

degrees of infectivity and virulence. COVID-19 vaccines were developed rapidly and deployed to the general public beginning in December 2020, made available through government and international programmes such as COVAX, aiming to provide vaccine equity. Treatments include novel antiviral drugs and symptom control. Common mitigation...
0f31984f4e Strep throat is spread by respiratory droplets from an infected person, spread by talking, coughing or sneezing, or by touching something that has droplets on it and then touching the mouth, nose, or eyes. It may be spread directly through touching infected sores. It may also be spread by contact with skin infected with group A strep. COVID-19 pandemic The World Health Organization (WHO) declared the outbreak a public health emergency of international concern (PHEIC) on 30 January 2020 and assessed it as having become a pandemic on 11 March. The WHO declared that the public health emergency caused by COVID-19 had ended in May 2023, while noting that COVID-19 continued to be a global health threat.
