Most animals have a "through-gut" or complete digestive tract. Exceptions are more primitive ones: sponges have small pores (ostia) throughout their body for digestion and a

larger dorsal pore (osculum) for excretion, comb jellies have both a ventral mouth and dorsal anal pores, while cnidarians and acoels have a single pore for both digestion and excretion. a662cea586 A monogastric digestive tract is slightly different from other types of digestive tracts such as a ruminant and avian. Ruminant organisms have a four-chambered complex stomach and avian organisms have a two-chambered stomach. An example of a ruminant and avian are cattle and chickens. a662cea586

Placentation The function of placentation is to transfer nutrients, respiratory gases, and water from maternal tissue to a growing embryo, and in some instances to remove waste from the embryo. Placentation is best known in live-bearing mammals (Theria), but also occurs in some fish, reptiles, amphibians, a diversity of invertebrates, and flowering plants. In vertebrates, placentas have evolved more than 100 times independently, with the majority of these instances occurring in squamate reptiles. The formation of all syncytiotrophoblast is from the fusion of two or more cytotrophoblasts via this fusion pathway. This pathway is important because the syncytiotrophoblast plays an important role in fetal-maternal gas exchange, nutrient exchange, and immunological and metabolic functions. a662cea586

Yolk sac The yolk sac is one of the fetal membranes and is important in early embryonic blood supply. 1 Heart 2 Amniotic cavity 3 Embryo 4 Body-stalk 5 Placental villi 6 Allantois The yolk sac is a membranous sac attached to an embryo, formed by cells of the hypoblast layer of the bilaminar embryonic disc. This is alternatively called the umbilical vesicle by the Terminologia Embryologica (TE), though yolk sac is far more widely used. In humans much of it is incorporated into the primordial gut during the fourth week of embryonic development. stage of allantoic development with commencing constriction of the yolk-sac a662cea586

The cytotrophoblast is considered to be the trophoblastic stem cell because the layer

surrounding the blastocyst remains while daughter cells differentiate and proliferate to function in multiple roles. There are two lineages that cytotrophoblastic cells may differentiate through: fusion and invasive. Monogastric Examples of monogastric herbivores include horses, rabbits, and guinea pigs. The defining feature of a monogastric is that it has a simple single-chambered stomach (one stomach). Herbivores have a plant-based diet, omnivores have a plant and meat-based diet, and carnivores only eat meat. A monogastric can be classified as an herbivore,

an omnivore (facultative carnivore), or a carnivore (obligate carnivore). Srivilliputhur The most important landmark of Srivilliputhur is 11-tiered tower structure dedicated to the Vatapatrasayee (Vishnu), the presiding deity of the Srivilliputhur Divya Desam. The placenta can be defined as an organ formed by the sustained apposition or fusion of fetal membranes and parental tissue for physiological exchange. Jansky-Bielschowsky disease Symptoms appear between ages 2 and 4 and consist of typical neurodegenerative complications: loss of muscle function (ataxia), drug resistant seizures (epilepsy), apraxia, development of muscle twitches (myoclonus), and vision impairment. Jansky-Bielschowsky disease is related to late-infantile Batten disease and LINCL, and is under the umbrella of neuronal ceroid lipofuscinosis. The reduced function of these enzymes results in insufficient or incomplete breakdown of proteins, consequently resulting in the buildup of lipopigments Jansky-Bielschowsky disease is an extremely rare autosomal recessive genetic disorder that is part of the neuronal ceroid lipofuscinosis (NCL)

family of neurodegenerative disorders. This late-infantile form of the disease progresses rapidly once symptoms are onset and ends in death between age 8 and teens. chorionic villi. The prevalence of Jansky-Bielschowsky disease is unknown; however, NCL collectively affects an estimated 1 in 100,000 individuals worldwide. It is caused by the accumulation of lipopigments in the body due to a deficiency in tripeptidyl peptidase I as a result of a mutation in the TPP1 gene a662cea586

Gastrointestinal tract Food taken in through the mouth is digested to extract nutrients and absorb energy, and the waste expelled at the anus as feces. The tract is one of the largest of the body's systems. The GI tract contains all the major organs of the digestive system, in humans and other animals, including the esophagus, stomach, and intestines. The combination of the circular folds, the villi, and the microvilli increases the absorptive area of the mucosa about 600-fold The gastrointestinal tract (also called the GI tract, digestive tract, and the alimentary canal) is the tract or passageway of the digestive system that

leads from the mouth to the anus. about 30 m2 (320 sq ft). Gastrointestinal is an adjective meaning of or pertaining to the stomach and intestines a662cea586
