Dual process theory Dual process theories can be found in social, personality, cognitive, and clinical psychology. Often, the two processes consist of an implicit (automatic), unconscious process and an explicit (controlled), conscious process. The names stand for "Long wavelength sensitive," "middle wavelength sensitive," and "short wavelength sensitive. These cone-opponent mechanisms were at one time thought to be the neural substrate for a psychological theory called Hering's Opponent Colors Theory, which calls for three psychologically important opponent color processes: red versus green, blue versus yellow, and black versus white (luminance). " The opponent-process theory implicates three opponent channels: L versus M, S versus (L+M), and a luminance channel (+ versus -). However, it has been argued that Hering's Opponent Colors Theory lacks adequate phenomenological and empirical support, and may not be a necessary feature of normal human color experience.
