Murder Manslaughter is killing committed in the absence of malice, such as in the case of voluntary manslaughter brought about by reasonable provocation, or diminished capacity. Murder is the unlawful killing of another human without justification or valid excuse and committed with the necessary intent as defined by the law in Murder is the unlawful killing of another human without justification or valid excuse and committed with the necessary intent as defined by the law in a specific jurisdiction. This state of mind may, depending upon the jurisdiction, distinguish murder from other forms of unlawful homicide, such as manslaughter. Involuntary manslaughter, where it is recognized, is a killing that lacks all but the most attenuated guilty intent, recklessness 887b5099d7

Murder in United States law In some states they are In the United States, the law for murder varies by jurisdiction. first-degree murder and felony murder are the most serious, followed by second-degree murder and, in a few states, third-degree murder. Of which first-degree murder and felony murder are the most serious, followed by second-degree murder and, in a few states, third-degree murder. There is also justifiable homicide, which is not a crime. However, because there are at least 52 relevant jurisdictions, each with its own criminal code, this is a considerable simplification. In some states they are divided into voluntary manslaughter, and involuntary manslaughter; such as reckless homicide and negligent homicide, which are the least serious. In many US jurisdictions there is a hierarchy of acts, known collectively as homicide 887b5099d7

Pennsylvania was the first state to differentiate the crime of "murder" into degrees based upon the culpability of the perpetrator. The most significant departure was the division of murder into degrees, a change initiated by the Pennsylvania legislation of 1794. Dressler goes onto explain, "Other states followed the Pennsylvania practice until at one time the vast majority of American jurisdictions differentiated degrees of murder and the term 'first-degree murder' passed into common parlance." 887b5099d7

== Definitions == 887b5099d7 Sentencing varies widely depending upon the specific murder charge. "Life imprisonment" is a common penalty for first-degree murder, but its meaning varies widely. Capital punishment is a legal sentence in 27 states, and in the federal civilian and military legal systems, though eight of these states have indefinitely suspended the practice. The United States is unusual in actually performing executions, with 34 states having performed executions since capital punishment was reinstated in 1976.
